

## TAX INCOME WILL INCREASE IN 1907

TAX ASSESSOR HOLT ESTIMATES COLLECTION OF HIS DIVISION DURING PRESENT YEAR WILL RUN OVER MILLION DOLLARS—SHOWS INCREASE OF NEARLY \$100,000 OVER YEAR OF 1906—ESTIMATE MAY BE TOO CONSERVATIVE.

Many assessments are to be increased this year. Tax Assessor Holt said this morning that the year of 1906 had been quite a profitable one especially for the sugar plantations, and he believed that there would be an increase in the assessments of both property holdings as well as income taxes. His deputies will start to work on Monday.

"Last year was a profitable one for sugar people especially, and there ought to be considerable increase in incomes from that source. In consequence there will be proportionate increases in the taxes of property showing increase of income.

## Sheriff Iaukea Springs Surprise

WILL DISCHARGE ANY POLICE OFFICER WHO INSISTS ON HOLDING OFFICE IN ANY POLITICAL ORGANIZATION—FAYOR LAW MAKING IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR A SHERIFF TO SUCCEED HIMSELF—WILL CUT OUT ALL POLITICS

Sheriff Iaukea has caused a big sensation in the police department and among politicians by announcing that he will post a notice in the station to the effect that all members of the police department who are officers in any political club or organization, whether Republican, Democratic, House Rule or what not, must either resign from their offices in the political clubs or get out of the police department.

Sheriff Iaukea went on to say that if he ever again ran for the office of sheriff it would be on his merits and solely subject to the expressed wish of the people, and that he would not work as a politician for the office again.
