## CORNELL HAS GREAT RECORD

**HAS WON MORE ATHLETIC HONORS THAN ANY OTHER UNIVERSITY THIS YEAR.**

Cornell this year has won more high honors and had a more consistent record of success in Eastern intercollegiate athletics than any other university. She now holds the championship in two of the four "major" sports, rowing and track athletics, and a high place in base ball and fourth in foot ball. Of the "minor" sports Cornell is first in the cross country running and lacrosse, and is tied with two other colleges for the cricket championship. Thus out of the twelve generally recognized college sports the Ithacans hold four and a third championships. No other Eastern college comes anywhere near this record.

It was not so many years ago that the Ithaca university was practically unknown in athletics, except in the strict branch of rowing. Cornell has had winning crews for thirty years. Then the Ithacans came to the front in 1890 with a winning cross country team, and in this branch of sport they have been defeated only once since. In 1905 they confounded the prophets by taking the first place in the intercollegiate track and field meet. This championship Cornell retains, having won by an increased score last May.

The oldest sport at Cornell is rowing, and that has been going on since 1871, three years after the university was inaugurated. In 1875 came Cornell's first great success on the water, a victory over twelve other colleges in the great race on Saratoga lake. It was repeated the next year, although many colleges had in the meantime withdrawn from the rowing association, so that only six crews were entered. Cornell made a clean sweep. After 1876 the old Rowing association of American Colleges broke up, and ownership of Cornell declined for lack of rivalry.

In the eighties the sport was revived and Courtney was engaged as permanent coach. Cornell's record of success since then has been phenomenal. She has won race after race with rival colleges, and has broken her own records for three and four miles repeatedly. Twice the crew has got the "Henley fever," in 1881 and again in 1895—but both trips abroad were fiasco, and for ten years past Cornell has been content to row at home. Yale and Harvard were beaten by Cornell in 1897 and 1898. Syracuse won the Poughkeepsie regatta in 1904, but the next year Cornell took revenge in an overwhelming victory. Her crew finished a quarter of a mile ahead of Syracuse, Pennsylvania, Columbia, Wisconsin and Georgetown. Another victory was won last year. The varsity crew also beat Harvard in 1905 and 1906.

It was in 1905 that Cornell came to the front in track athletics. Under the coaching of John F. Moakier, who had been engaged in 1899, the track squad had grown consistently better year by year. In cross country running there have been eight intercollegiate contests in as many years, and Cornell has captured seven of them, being beaten only in 1901, when Yale and Pennsylvania finished ahead of her.

The base ball team of last season lost only three of its important games, two to Princeton and one to Yale. For the past three years the foot ball team has been coached by Glenn S. Warner, who graduated from Cornell in 1895, and made his reputation as a gridiron coach and strategist at the Carlisle Indian school. This year the team went through the season with but one defeat, being beaten by Princeton, 14 to 5.

Cornell men are proudest, not of the magnitude or number of their victories, but of the cleanliness of them, and of the fact that all their teams are free from any taint of foul play or professionalism. Attention has been called to the fact that of all big foot ball teams in the East this fall, Cornell was the only one which did not have a man ordered off the field by an official.

## KAUAI RAILROAD.
