Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu. Hawaiian standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time of high tide at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 6 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE-WEATHER BUREAU.

The following data, covering a period of 22 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau and McKibbin records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question, for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Month February for 22 years.

TEMPERATURE (1880-1906).
Mean or normal temperature, 75°
The warmest month was that of 1897, with an average of 74°
The coldest month was that of 1903, with an average of 67°
The highest temperature was 82° on February 17, 1890; February 16, 1897 and February 22, 1906.
The lowest temperature was 52° on February 16, 1922.

PRECIPITATION (rain 1877-1894, and 1905-6).
Average for the month, 4.52 inches.
Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 12.
The greatest monthly precipitation was 14.00 inches in 1893.
The least monthly precipitation was 0.24 inches in 1906.
The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 8.65 inches on February 27, 1888.

RELATIVE HUMIDITY.*
Average 9 a. m., 73%; average 9 p. m., 79% (1890-1904). Average 8 a. m., 70%; average 3 p. m., 70% (1905-6).

CLOUDS AND WEATHER (1890-1906).
Average number of clear days, 9; partly cloudy days 13; cloudy days, 6.

WIND.
The prevailing winds are from the northeast (1875-1894, 1905-6).
The average hourly velocity of the wind is 7.2 miles (1905-6).
The highest velocity of the wind during 1905 and 1906 was 26 miles from the southwest on February 17, 1905.
