GUN SHOOT WAS PLEASANT AFFAIR

THE HAWAIIAN GUN CLUB HELD ITS ANNUAL SHOOT YESTERDAY AND GOOD TIME WAS HAD.

The Hawaii Gun Club's shoot took place yesterday and an enjoyable day spent. Lunch was served at noon and the shoot did not finish until 4:30 p. m.

D. L. Austin won the gold medal given to the member securing the highest average during the day. The first event, the 20-bird scratch was brought on at nine a. m. This event was one of the most important of the shoot, and carried with it the directors' cup, and the championship of the club.

The second event, the 10-bird scratch, unknown angles, for the E. O. Hall & Son cup, had also to be won twice. It has been won once each by K. B. Porter, H. E. Gares, W. E. Wall and J. W. Harvey. In the first trial, D. L. Austin, K. G. Porter and J. W. Harvey were made a tie with eight each. They shot off with the scores respectively of 8, 8 and 6.

The third event was the visitors' match, 10-bird scratch, known angles. The first prize, a cup, was won by P. J. Bell with a score of ten; the second, by Mrs. James Scott with 9; and the third by A. Lucas, with 5.

The fourth event, 20-bird handicap, known angles, for the Walkroda cup, has been won once each by K. B. Porter, H. E. Gares, L. C. King and J. W. Harvey. Yesterday the results were as follows: 1st, J. L. Fleming, 21 out of 25; 2nd, K. B. Porter, 20 scratch; 3rd, D. L. Austin, 19 out of 20; and 4th, W. E. Wall, 18 out of 25.

The fifth event was a combination match, 21 birds, 6 known angles, 6 unknown angles, 6 unknown angles and traps, 3 doubles, and each bird broken to score as one. The first prize, a cup was won by D. L. Austin, 21; 2nd, J. W. Harvey, 19; and the 3rd, K. B. Porter, 15.

Then the visitors were given another chance in the 10-bird scratch, known angles. Mrs. James Scott won the first prize, a cup, 8; A. Lucas, the second 6; and J. E. Beck, the third, 3.

The seventh event was the merchandise match, a 20-bird handicap for class shooting. The first prize was a 22-cal. Winchester repeating rifle. The results were as follows: 1st, J. L. Fleming, 22 out of 26; 2nd, A. Waterhouse, 19 out of 30; 3rd, D. L. Austin, 18 out of 20; 4th, K. B. Porter, 17 out of 20; and 5th, J. W. Harvey, 16 out of 20.

The eighth and last event was a consolation event, open only to those who had not won a prize during the day. In the first try, the results were as follows: 1. Spalding, 11 out of 11; G. A. Jordan, 11 out of 13; and Dr. Machall, 5 out of 15. The tie of the first two was shot off, giving I. Spalding first place with 11 out of 11; and G. A. Jordan 2nd, with 9 out of 13. The first prize for this event was 100 Pacific shells.
