WHY NOMINATIONS WERE HELD UP

FIFTH DISTRICT OBJECTS TO THE GOVERNOR'S IMPLIED SUGGESTIONS OF INCOMPETENCY.

IN THE SENATE. ELEVENTH DAY. AFTERNOON SESSION.

In the Senate yesterday afternoon the Governor's vacation appointments came up for confirmation. The question of citizenship was raised in the case of T. Clive Davies and E. W. Jordan trustees of the Queen's Hospital. Both nominations were held up pending an inquiry as to the law on the subject and the determination of the question of Mr. Jordan's citizenship, which President Bishop was not certain of, though he said he thought he was a British subject. Mr. Jordan is an American citizen and has been for several years.

The Senate confirmed the appointment of E. C. Peters, Attorney General; G. P. Wilder to the Board of Agriculture; George D. Huddy, to the Dental Board. The nomination of L. E. Kellogg as a member of the Board of Agriculture and Forestry seems to be seriously opposed, and consideration of it went over until Friday.

The nominations for Road Board positions were not acted on as the Road Boards have been abolished by the County Act.

The nominations of E. M. Watson, W. E. Brown, T. C. Stroup, J. J. Byrne, E. A. Mott-Smith, L. J. Warren and W. H. McLellan as election inspectors were all deferred until Friday afternoon on motion of Senator Lane.

The objection to these is understood to be that they are all residents of the Fourth District and were appointed inspectors in the Fifth District, which some of the Fifth District men think is a reflection on their constituents, as though it were in effect that the Governor said that men of character and ability to fill these positions could not be found in the Fifth District.

Action on these nominations yesterday was made in open session though this is contrary to general custom. Usually they are considered in executive session. The motion to consider them in open session was made by Senator Chillingworth. It was carried by a vote of seven to six.

The nomination of E. O. White as commissioner of fences for Ewa and Waianae went over until Friday as he is not a resident of either of those districts.

H. C. Overend, Maul, dead; Harry Gregson, Kauai, removed; W. L. Mossman of Maul, removed, and H. Hanenberg, Maui, removed; all nominated election inspectors, were not confirmed for the reasons indicated.

TERRITORIAL ESTIMATES

HOUSE RECEIVES AND CONSIDERS THEM IN COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE.

THE HOUSE. ELEVENTH DAY. AFTERNOON SESSION.

Treasurer Campbell laid before the Committee of the Whole House his estimate for the Bureau of Taxes as follows: Incidentals first division \$3,000; second division \$1,800; third division \$3,000; fourth division \$1,400. All approved.

Mr. Morriam asked \$3,500 for the Bureau of Conveyances. Approved.

The Superintendent of Public Works, C. S. Holloway presented his estimates on which action was deferred as follows: General expenses, \$9,500; maintenance and repairs \$42,000; landings and wharves \$45,000; rent of land for kerosene warehouse \$600; maintenance of sewers Honolulu \$29,000; extension of sewers \$12,000; maintenance of sewers, Hilo, \$2,000. The following items passed: expenses pilots, Honolulu, \$300; expenses pilot, Hilo, \$250; expenses pilot, Kahului \$250; expenses harbor-master, Honolulu \$200; purchase of flags, \$300. The items of \$1500 for the purchase of helms and compasses and \$200 for Kapiolani Park were stricken out.

Mr. Holloway also asked for the maintenance of water work, \$75,540 for Honolulu, \$3600 for Hilo and \$5000 for all others. Action on these items was also deferred. The committee's report was adopted.

The governor notified the House that he had signed Senate bill No. 23, Act 4, relating to the Board of Agriculture. The bill authorizes the governor to set aside government lands for forest reserves, whether under lease or not.

The Civic Federation, through its secretary, Ed Towse, asked the House to furnish it a copy of each bill. Mr. Towse also stated that the organization is ready to appear before the House when wanted.

At 4 o'clock the House adjourned until 9 this morning.

HAS FILED A DEMURRER.

H. W. Condon, through his attorney A. S. Humphreys, has filed a demurrer to the amended complaint issued from Judge Whitney's court, charging Condon with interfering with an officer. It is contended in the demurrer, that the complaint does not set forth specifically the time of the alleged offence. The matter will be heard before Judge Robinson tomorrow morning.

STEALING FEDERAL WOOD.

Certain unlicensed pirates have been poaching on the United States fortification lands at Diamond Head and cutting wood. They will be brought to account.

SEVENTEEN GAMBLERS FINED.

Seventeen gamblers arrested by Chief Taylor and Detective Leal at the Smith and Hotel street "fort" have been each fined \$20 and costs. Evidence in court included iron bars used as barricades and other souvenirs of the "fort."
