## SCHOOL STREET PEOPLE TO MEET

AN EFFORT TO GET A SMALL STRETCH OF THE STREET IMPROVED MAKING A BOULEVARD

A meeting has been called of all property owners and residents on School street, at the residence of Postmaster J. G. Pratt for 8 o'clock. The object of the meeting is to see if some thing cannot be done to secure the improvement of the short portion of School street between Nuuanu and Fort. With the exception of this portion, the entire street is well macadamized, and forms a splendid boulevard between the Palama and Kalihi sections of the city and Makiki. It is free from car tracks and makes a regular boulevard.

The Supervisors have not improved this part of the street before because an expensive bridge is needed at Pa-uoa stream. But it is claimed that the present wooden bridge can be made serviceable at small expense, and that with the improvement of the small stretch of street indicated would make a through boulevard connecting two otherwise distant parts of the city.

## MAY FURTHER LIMIT SALOONS

LICENSE COMMISSION DISCUSSES ADVISABILITY OF HAVING NO SALOONS ABOUT FISH MARKET

A meeting of the Liquor License Commission was held yesterday afternoon. The most important measure considered was the question of granting licenses for saloons in the immediate vicinity of the fish market. Chief of Detectives Taylor was present and asked relative to this matter. He said that a large percentage of persons arrested for intoxication said on the Monday morning following the Saturday of their arrest, that they had bought the liquor in some saloon near the fish market. He said that the presence of numerous intoxicated or half intoxicated men in that part of the town made it very unpleasant for women to visit the fish market on Saturday afternoon. In response to a question Taylor said that the refusal on the part of the Commission to issue licenses within a block of the Fish Market would remedy the trouble, provided too many licenses were not issued in that one section. The matter will be further considered at a later meeting.

The matter of various applications for licenses was considered. Many of the applicants did not appear to have gained the correct idea in filling out the blanks. It is necessary that description of the frontage, depth and other details of the property where the saloon license is desired be given.

W. P. Fennell, the new License Inspector, took his oath of office and was also given a commission by Sheriff Iaukea.

The question of granting a saloon license at Kahauiki near the military reservation was discussed. Some of the members of the commission thought that a license should be granted when the regular troops are moved there from Camp McKinley. No action was taken however.
