Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu. Honolulu standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m. which is the same as Greenwich, 6 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

TIDE, WEATHER BUREAU.

The following data, covering a period of 33 years, have been compiled from the McKibbin and Weather Bureau records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question, for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Month January for 33 years.

TEMPERATURE.

(1870-1907.) Mean or normal temperature 71 deg. The warmest month was that of 1898 with an average of 72 deg. The coldest month was that of 1905 with an average of 67 deg. The highest temperature was 84 deg. on the 19th, 1891. The lowest temperature was 54 deg. on the 27th 1899.

PRECIPITATION.

(Rain, 29 years, 1878-94, 1900-7.) Average for the month, 3.53 inches. Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 12. The greatest monthly precipitation was 12.41 inches in 1907. The least monthly precipitation was 0.17 inch in 1878. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 5.30 inches on the 25th, 1878.

Average 9 a. m. 72 per cent; average 9 p. m. 78 per cent; (1890-1904.) Average 8 a. m. 72 per cent; average 8 p. m. 74 per cent 1905-7.

CLOUDS AND WEATHER.

(1890-1907.) Average number of clear days, 17; partly cloudy days, 14; cloudy days, 6.

WIND.

(Direction, 23 years, velocity 3 years.) (1875-94, 1905-7.) The prevailing winds are from the NE.

The average hourly velocity of the wind is 8.5 miles (1905-7.) The highest velocity of the wind was 43 miles from the SW on the 18th 1906, (1907-7.)
