BILL OF SALE.

A bill of sale dated February 23th, 1908, from Sarah B. Deverill and Martha Berger to the trustees of the Bishop Museum has just been entered for record by which the Bishop Museum acquires for \$1000 the extensive collection of ethnological specimens collected by the late W. E. H. Deverill, of Hanalei, Kauai. The collection is enumerated in the bill of sale and consists of a great variety of implements used by the ancient Hawaiians in war and domestic arts.
The collection was mortgaged to Mrs. Berger in 1900 for a loan of \$1500, and by this bill of sale she has relinquished her claim to the collection. Sarah B. Deverill is the widow of the late W. E. H. Deverill, who was well known in the Territory. He was an enthusiastic collector of Hawaiian antiquities, and his collection is considered one of the most complete and valuable
