S. S. VADERLAND AND 1600 PEOPLE ABOARD SAFE

ANTWERP, June 1.—The Red Star Liner Vaderland, concerning which an unconfirmed Paris rumor yesterday had it that she had foundered in a fog near Dover, England, with 1,600 passengers has arrived here safe, having experienced no worse adventure than slight trouble with her machinery which delayed her and gave rise to the story of her foundering.

SUGAR BREAKS THE RECORD THIS YEAR

QUICKEST GRINDING EVER DONE ON ANY HAWAIIAN SUGAR CROP. WILL BE ALL THROUGH IN JULY—GREAT INCREASES IN OUTPUT OF THE LARGER PLANTATIONS—QUICK DISPATCH IN SHIPPING THE PRODUCT.

A record is being made for the sugar industry of Hawaii this year in more ways than one.

In the first place the grinding will be all over in July and the crop shipped to market close on the heels of the milling performance. Waituku with a largely increased crop over last year's, completed grinding the past month.

When it is remembered that, not many years ago, the grinding season was not over until the new calendar year had begun, the great advance the Hawaiian planters have made both in harvesting and milling the cane may be realized.

Along with the expedition in harvesting, there has been great dispatch in shipping this year's sugar crop of Hawaii. Besides the quantities carried away by steamers both to San Francisco and by the Isthmus of Tehuantepec route, a large fleet of wind-jammers has been chartered for the round the Horn passage as well as to San Francisco. Sailing vessels have

been rushed hither in ballast to help keep the sugar warehouses clear.

This morning a Star reporter visited the various plantation agencies to obtain a comparative statement of the output last year and this. All of them did not have estimates made, but from the majority of reports cheerfully rendered the following compilation is presented. In the main it exhibits increases all along the line, the figures representing tons of sugar:



HAULING BIG GUNS



The second of the large sections of the great mortar carriages for the Diamond Head fort has been hauled out to the fortress end of the island, from the railway depot, by the Honolulu Construction and Draying Company. The section shown on the drey in tow of the steam roller in the picture weighs sixteen and a half tons, the drey having a capacity of twenty-five tons. W. H. Hoogs, of the hauling and building company named, personally superintended the task of getting the big lump of metal out to Leahi. Depot Quartermaster Captain Humphrey and United States Engineer Captain Otwell were much pleased with the job. The five fifteen-ton mortars will next be carried to position and the rest of the ordnance is coming in the Honolua.

THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR TO ARRIVE IN HONOLULU JUNE 16.

GLEM QUINN NOW A LAWYER

IS ADMITTED TO PRACTICE IN THE TERRITORIAL AND FEDERAL COURTS.

Clement Carl Quinn was showered with honors this morning and is wearing a grin that won't come off as the result. When the Supreme Court met this morning Chief Justice Hartwell announced from the bench that Clem had passed his examination successfully and proceeded to swear him in as an attorney licensed to practice law in any and all the courts of the Territorial Government. After taking the oath Quinn received the congratulations of the attorneys who were in court.

Immediately following this another pleasant scene for the new attorney took place in the Federal Court, where Quinn's name was proposed by U. S. District Attorney Breckons and seconded by Attorney Clemons. He was promptly admitted to practice before Judge Dole.

Before taking his examination for the bar about a month ago Quinn was hailed in Judge Robinson's court, having held the position for five years. He has been in this city for ten years and is a native of the state of Iowa.

\$200,000 CASH NOW AVAILABLE

BILL AUTHORIZES CONTRACT FOR ENTIRE BUILDING—DELEGATE KALANIANOOLE HAS SECURED THE FLAG THAT FLEW OVER THE CAPITOL WHEN THE BILL PASSED FOR CORNER STONE LAYING AND INAUGURATION OF THE EDIFICE.

Washington, D. C., May 29, 1908. EDITOR HAWAIIAN STAR:—No success that has been achieved for Hawaii since I have been in Congress has been more gratifying to me than that of securing \$250,000 for a Federal building in Honolulu. The work for Pearl Harbor, although complicated, had the support of national considerations; but a Federal building is a local proposition, and to secure adequate appropriations in that line is generally considered one of the most difficult things in a Congressman's career. As the bill passed the House on Friday last, Hawaii has the happy distinction of having the largest item allowed in this bill to any city in the entire country, the next largest item being \$750,000 for a new postoffice site in Chicago.

Hawaii Bills Are In Doubt

MAUI ELECTRIC AND WAHIAWA WATER FRANCHISES PASS THE HOUSE BUT THEIR PASSAGE BY THE SENATE IS DOUBTFUL—FINAL PASSAGE OF SHIPPING BILL ALSO PRECARIOUS—SAVINGS BANK BILL GOES THROUGH.

Washington, D. C., May 29. The fortification bill as agreed upon in conference carries \$65,000 additional for submarine mining equipment for Hawaii, giving us a total of \$1,165,000 in all.

Through the arrangement of grouping a number of bills from the Committee on Territories into one omnibus bill, we were able yesterday to get through the House the two electric franchise bills for Waialua and Lahaina, and the Waialua Water Co. franchise bill. Congress is now in such a wrought up state over the disputed currency and anti-injunction legislation that it is impossible to say whether we can get these bills through the Senate before adjournment or not.

The same conditions, together with the efforts for adjournment, make very uncertain the fate of my shipping bills in both House and Senate.

At our hearing before the Senate Committee on Thursday last, both Gov. Freat and Mr. McClellan spoke in answer to the arguments of Maxwell Everts, who opposed the bill on behalf of the Pacific Mail and Oceanic S. S. companies. The committee then voted to report the bill favorably, with an amendment designed to make more clear the intent of the amendment made by the House committee.

For a number of days past, we have had promise of recognition for this bill in the House, but the pressure of conference reports and general bills has thus far prevented our being reached.

The bill to close up the Postal Savings Bank affairs has passed Congress. Very truly yours, J. KALANIANOOLE.
