Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu. Honolulu standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m. which is the same as Greenwich, 0 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

THE LOG-BOOK

The Bulletin yesterday and the Advertiser this morning refer to the allegation that young Spreckels is causing the T. K. K. S. S. Matson Navigation S. S. Hilonian, Captain Peter Johnson, with Christmas trees at her mastheads, arrived from San Francisco at 8:30 last evening, docking at the foot of Nuuanu street. She brought three days' mail, 253 sacks, and over 2,000 tons of general merchandise, including about 500 tons of Christmas goods. Her promenade deck was decorated with Christmas greenery and the boat presented a pretty picture as revealed by her lights and the lights of the wharf. It was to accommodate the Christmas stores and the Christmas shoppers that Captain Johnson brought his vessel in last night instead of this morning. Captain Johnson conferred with the passengers in this regard, and on being assured that Honolulu folks would be glad to receive the Hilonian last night, he decided to rush her for the holiday desire. A pleasant trip was enjoyed by the Hilonian. A wireless from the Lurline, which left Kahului on Saturday, however, is to the effect that the latter vessel is bucking heavy seas and winds, which the Hilonian just escaped. W. H. Hoogs and J. F. Morgan were two of the prominent returning Honoluluans. The Hilonian passengers gave an amateur concert and theatrical entertainment during the trip, managed by Captain Johnson who also was one of the performers. Mrs. H. T. Moore led the orchestra; J. F. Morgan, of course, was treasurer; Captain Johnson told how to stop a ship from rolling and Charles F. Drew gave a Stein song. Prof. S. B. Naddams gave a wireless dissertation and Billy Hoogs was the main sound in a quintet.

AUSTRAL SAILS

After being rigged in record time, the four-masted American ship Austral sailed from New York on December 5 with a cargo of coal for San Francisco. The Austral is under charter to the United States government, her cargo being for the Army at Mare Island. The departure of the Austral is her second on the present voyage. She first sailed from Baltimore on September 20th, but on October 4th she encountered a terrific hurricane which lasted three days. In this storm the three topgallant masts, with topgallant and royal yards and all sails, were carried away. She was picked up by tug and towed into New York on October 15th. The owners were anxious for quick

The bark Andrew Welch sails at 10 a. m. tomorrow for San Francisco. She takes over 500 tons of sugar and several passengers.

Local Federal Inspectors of Hulls and Boilers find that steamers of the Inter-Island Company are well supplied with life-boats.

S. S. Pleiades, chartered by the American-Hawaiian, sails on January 1 for Honolulu from Seattle. She is due here January 10. A-H. S. S. Alaskan leaves San Francisco for Honolulu on the day before Christmas. S. S. Virginian sails for Honolulu from San Francisco on January 3 instead of January 5. The Lellehua cavalry horses are to arrive in the Virginian. S. S. Columbian leaves Honolulu at 5 p. m. today for other island ports, leaving Hilo on January 2 for Salina Cruz.

Aboard the Hilonian on the trip down the passengers were almost daily furnished with wireless news from San Francisco or Honolulu.

The Astral registers 3292 tons gross. She is one of the three American sailing ships owned by the Standard Oil Company, and one of the largest wind-jammers in the world. New York papers are still talking of this great feat, said to be the largest rigging job ever undertaken on a sailing ship in the port of New York.

The Astral is well known in Honolulu and interest is added by the fact that Major Purdy's son is aboard, completing his nautical education.
