HAND PLANS ROAD RUNS

Dr. Hand of the Y. M. C. A. will shortly inaugurate a series of progressive road and cross country runs for the benefit of intending competitors in the Y. M. C. A. Marathon, and others.

The first run will probably take place next Monday night and will be over a short course.

THE HOUSE

SIXTH DAY.

Pursuant to the purpose of a House resolution, Land Commissioner Pratt sent to the House an itemized statement of moneys spent during 15 months ending December 31, 1908, by his department under "incidental appropriation." Some of the items follow: Advertising \$2,880.36; appraising \$2,540.48; extra help \$1,008.51; traveling expenses for the Commissioner himself, \$702.08; Newell investigation travel cost, \$159.90; printing, etc., \$445.75; wireless telegrams, \$52.35.

Chief Clerk Conking of the office of the Territorial Secretary wrote, complying with order of the House to give list of employees.

E. A. Mott-Smith, as Commissioner of Immigration, gets \$25 per month, though he probably has other means of livelihood. D. L. Conking earns \$150 per month, or that is what he gets paid. He may earn more. H. C. O'Sullivan gets \$125, Robert Lomo \$55, Fred Cockett \$50, Archives Librarian Lydecker \$150; J. H. Wise \$100, Edgar S. Barry (clerk national guard) \$75, S. W. Kaipano, janitor and armorer \$10.

Makekai put in a resolution for \$10,000 for waterworks at Kalaheo, S. Kona, Hawaii.

SMITH EMBARRASSED. Clerk Henry Smith of the Judiciary department, in reply to the House's requisition for lists of departmental employees and their salaries, wrote to say he was embarrassed because the head of the department, the Chief Justice had not been addressed. He would have to get his Chief's permission to leave his regular duties long enough to gather the information desired by the House.

CRAZY JOB HARD. Insane Asylum guards and nurses petitioned for a raise in pay owing to the steadily increasing number of patients admitted they (the inmates) numbering 217 and owing to the unusual long hours of work performed by the guards and nurses, in that they have to work alternately in 8 hour shifts, including Sundays, and further owing to the constant danger of vicious attacks to which they are always exposed. The guards want to be raised from \$50 to \$65 and the nurses would like \$50 instead of \$40 per month. Referred to police and health committee.

FISHMARKETS IN WILDERNESS. Kealawaa put in a resolution for \$5,000 for a reinforced concrete fish-market building at Hakalau, Hawaii, and for \$2,500 for a similar structure at 9 Miles, Olan.

Kealawaa resolved for \$1,500 for a jailor's cottage at Kapoho, Puna, Hawaii.

Kealawaa, also, resolved for \$1,000 for a one-room school at Kiloahana, Kamaliika, Puna, Hawaii.

LAHAINA HOSPITAL. Hihio entered a bill to provide a hospital at Lahaina, Maui, to be known as the "Malu Ulu a Lele," for the benefit of indigents, those who are able being required to pay reasonable fees.

BRICKLAYERS' EXAM. Citizens, in writing represented to the House that the Road Department and other departments of the Territory have non-citizens doing all kinds of mason work who are unskilled and receive pay at \$1.75 per day whereas a mechanic in this and our line should receive not less than \$4.

It is prayed that a law be enacted whereby it shall be obligatory for all workers in this line to take an examination touching upon qualification, a certificate to be issued showing competency and that they are citizens and voters before they shall be allowed to work upon any government work.

Ruel Kinney put in a bill to amend Section 1212 and 1225 R. L., relating to the rate per cent for property taxation.

FURTADO'S INITIATIVE. Furtado put in a bill to reserve to the people the right of initiative and referendum and providing the manner in which such right may be used as to legislation in the Territory, a county, municipality, district or precinct.

THREE MILLIONS. Rice introduced a bill making appropriations for current expenses for the bi-annual period ending June 30, 1911, totaling \$3,248,225. It includes \$5,000 for promotion.

Health committee, Coney chairman, recommend that Nakaleka's resolution relating to an appropriation of \$1,000 for a hearse for Molokai settlement be laid on the table to be taken up with the appropriation bill.

Land Commissioner Pratt in a communication explains that the reason the opening of lands on other islands had been advertised only in Honolulu papers was that the money for that purpose had run short and he had to economize.

A message from the governor with a draft appropriation bill was received, the bill being introduced by Rice, being the three million dollar and more proposition above noted.

Furtado's "recall" receded, or rather he withdrew the notice of his first bill

and introduced the new-titled measure above mentioned.

Kinney's rate per cent for property taxation provides for a sliding scale, with the rate getting higher as the ability to pay increases, the minimum being half of one per cent when the total value exceeds \$5,000 while those assessed at \$100,000 or more are taxed at two per cent.

The miscellaneous committee favored Nakaleka's \$1.50 per day public laborer bill. Action was deferred.

Alfonso's bill to encourage the coffee industry is referred to the agricultural committee. Donhill's tenement house act was referred to the judiciary committee.

To prescribe and regulate the places where and the conditions under which carpenter, machine, blacksmith and other workshops, foundries, bakeries, and other factories, laundries, poi-shops, abattoirs, fishmarkets, and places where noxious trades or manufactures are carried on, hotels, tenements, lodging houses, theatres, and halls and places of public resort may be erected, maintained, used or operated.

To enact and to enforce all ordinances necessary to protect health, life and property, to prevent and summarily remove nuisances and to preserve and enforce the good government, order and security of the City and County and its inhabitants.

Whenever any ordinance shall be enacted, any general statute of the Territory of Hawaii in conflict with such ordinance shall cease to be operative within the City and County, so long as such ordinance shall remain in force.
