THE LOG-BOOK

In all probability the Niihau will go out tomorrow afternoon for Kaula.

The schooner Dauntless was towed out about 10 o'clock this morning and sailed for lumber ports.

The St. Katherine has finished discharging her cargo, been fumigated and will move over to the railroad wharf on Monday to begin taking sugar.

The lighthouse tender Kukui will get away Monday for a cruise around the island of Hawaii on lighthouse business, returning about Thursday of next week.

Captain Vaughan-Lewes and officers of H. M. B. S. Cambrian return the call of Mayor Fern at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning.

The John Brown who has libelled the R. P. Rithet says he is not, despite his color and name, a negro but a Frenchman. He claims to have been born in Southern France.

The Korea may be looked for early Monday morning from San Francisco, and the China in the mid-afternoon from Yokohama.

Cargo of the Kinau, which arrived early this morning from Kaula, consisted of the following: 6,645 bags sugar, 1 dog, 2 pigs and 10 packages.

At Hilo today are the Mary Wilkelmann, Annie Johnson and Columbian. The Columbian expected to get away today, but the storm upset her plans. She will likely make it Monday.

The big freighter Texan, Captain Hall, arrived off port at 7 o'clock this morning from Seattle and Tacoma. She was eight and a half days down, and has a rather rough passage. Her cargo is general merchandise for Honolulu and other island ports. The Texan is at the Hackfeld wharf.

The James H. Bruce, after being blown out of Mahukona, coming to Honolulu and returning again to the Hawaii ports, succeeded in discharging and is now taking sugar at Mahukona for San Francisco. She will sail early in the coming week.

The Maui will return tomorrow from Hawaii with a load of sugar and a deck load of cattle from Kawaihae. The Iwalani is loading sheep at Kawaihae today and will probably arrive back tomorrow afternoon. Both of these vessels had to lay off Thursday on account of the storm, or they could have gotten in today.

The Claudine bucked into rough sea after leaving the channel last night but as the weather moderated considerably shortly afterward she probably had a fairly smooth passage to Maui.

Purser Phillips, of the Mauna Kea, arriving this morning from Hawaii and Maui ports, reported the following sugar awaiting shipment on the big island: Oiaa, 29,154; Waiakea, 4,000; Hawaii Mill 2,000; Wainaku 4,000; Onomea, 14,000; Pepeekeo 11,400; Honoumou, 10,800; Hakalan 11,000; Laupahoehoe, 13,000; Ookala, 3,500; Kukaiaua \$9,190; Hamakua 22,000; Paauhau 3,200; Honokaa 13,000; Kukuhaele 5,000; Puna-luu 1,420; Honnapo, 3,132.

Purser J. L. Logan, of the Kinau, arriving this morning from Kaula, reported as follows: "Moderate to strong northeast winds the round trip. Rainy weather on Kaula. W. G. Hall discharging at Waimea. Failed to communicate with Noeau, but received report of unfavorable weather on windward side of island, from Noeau on Wednesday. Sugar left on Kaula ready for shipment consisted of the following: K. S. M., 5,100; V. K. 750; Mak., 2,000; G. & R., 385 McB., 20,000; Lihue, 3,069.
