The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m. which is the same as Greenwich, 0 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

**THE LOG-BOOK**  
 Yesterday was "cailing day" aboard the British cruiser Cambrian, and large number of people of all nationalities availed themselves of the privilege of inspecting her. Although just out of a cruise among South Sea Islands, the vessel arrived remarkably clean, and after a little polishing up she looked as bright as a new whistle. Another reception will likely be held Thursday afternoon, to which the "400" will be specially invited.  
 The James Makee returned Saturday night from Kauai, where she went to overhaul and replace buoys. Another trip over there will be made in a few days on the same business.  
 Purser John Kekuewa, of the Mikahala, arriving Sunday morning from Maui and Molokai reported as follows: "Experienced very rough weather while discharging freight on Molokai, Maui and Lanai. Inward trip same as outward. Lots of rain on all islands."  
 The Mikahala, arriving at 4 o'clock Sunday morning from Lanai, Lahaina and Molokai ports, brought the following cargo: 300 bags Olowalu sugar for Irwin & Co., 30 head Molokai ranch cattle for Metropolitan Meat Co., 17 cords wood, 1 bbl. goat skins, 1 pk. boiler plate, 2 cts. chickens, 2 bags coal, 10 bags coconuts, 17 boxes sundries, 10 pkgs. sundries, 45 hogs and 150 bags rice.  
 The oil steamer Santa Rita, Captain Connors, got away about 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon for San Francisco and oil ports. Although not certain, she will probably return to Honolulu with another oil cargo.  
 The Pacific Mail liner China will likely arrive this afternoon from Yokohama and Hongkong, sailing again tomorrow, probably about noon, for San Francisco.  
 At 1:50 Sunday morning the Maui docked at her wharf, having come in from Kawaihae. She brought 5,000 bags L. S. Co., and 1,000 bags Kohala-le, a total of 6,000; 77 head cattle, 110 bbls. hides, 19 gas drums and 78 packages.  
 It was so rough on Kauai that the Noeau made a failure of every effort to take sugar, and returned Sunday morning with only 135 bags Kilauea, for Irwin & Co. She also had 3 bags coffee and 8 sundry packages.  
 Weather reports of vessels arriving Sunday morning were: Stmr. Maui, from Kawaihae: "Very rough weather Hawaii coast." Mikahala, from Lanai, Lahaina and Molokai: "Rainy and stormy everywhere. Miserable weather going and coming." Noeau, from Kauai: "Very rough and lots of rain."

The fine American bark Poong Suey, Captain Willett, was sighted early this morning and came in before noon. She sails in the Brewer line of 114 days from New York, having sailed from that port on November 20. At Christmas time she was reported off Cape Horn. The Poong Suey brings a cargo of general merchandise.  
 There will be but one departure today for island ports, the Nihau sailing at 5 p. m. for Honokaa and other Hamakua points.
