SHOOTS SELF WITH PISTOL

At 9:20 o'clock yesterday morning Miss Bertha C. Rumble, dressmaker, aged about 50, shot and killed herself in room 7, Elite building, Hotel street.

Last night a coroner's jury, consisting of Horace N. Crabbe, E. F. Imhof, Makanaoka, J. F. Crowley and W. E. Hurr, inquired into the case and returned the following verdict: "That Bertha Rumble came to her death on the 14th day of March, 1909, from a gun-shot wound in the head, said wound being self-inflicted with suicidal intent."

At about the hour stated, Jack McFadden, who occupies a room opposite that of the suicide, was aroused from sleep by a pistol shot, followed in a few seconds by another shot. He jumped out of bed and ran into the hallway, where he met Mrs. Curry, mistress of the house, who had also heard the shots.

There was no question left as to intentional suicide. A whole pack of letters left on the table, addressed to different persons, were full of her troubles and intimating suicide in many ways. One of these letters, addressed to her landlady, was as follows: "Dear Mrs. Curry:

"You may not know nor surmise what my intentions are. But there are things both ways. One to end my days and one to live. I neglected myself and everything else for that reason. The way I was imposed upon by different ones. The last one is by no means the first one which I told you in a previous note. And to say I lost in every way expresses it all. The cruel injustice done me all along in every way, is or seems more than I can bear, saying I was a morphine senny. Did I feel guilty I should hide and deny it. But I deny nor hide nothing."

Other letters to J. A. Magoon were particularly pointed and bitter in the criticism of his handling of certain of her affairs, and another to Judge De Bolt complained of Mr. Magoon. Mrs. L. Bolton, of Hotel and Punchbowl streets, was also charged with causing many of the suicide's troubles, and some of the spicy letters of accusation were to that person.

Deceased was a native American of German parentage. She had lived in Honolulu twenty-five or thirty years. She was a step-aunt of Gus Rose and Mrs. Frank Kruger and leaves a sister in Oakland, Cal. It is said that she, at one time, had considerable money; but at the time of her death, had property interests of small value.
