SONG OF HAWAII STIRS EMOTION

An "emotional" sailing of a steamer from Seattle is described by the Times of that city in its issue of October 15 as follows:

With the strains of the Hawaiian farewell song, sung by the Hawaiian quartet that has been on the exposition grounds for months, floating back from the vessel, the steamship President, of the Pacific Coast Steamship Company, cleared for San Francisco this morning with 462 passengers. It was one of the most emotional sailings in some weeks.

The dock was crowded with friends and curious ones as the hour approached for the vessel to leave. At 10 o'clock the order was given to cast off and, with a long deep blast of her whistle, the immense liner began to slowly back from her slip. The members of the Hawaiian quartet, which has been stationed at the Hawaiian building at the fair, grouped themselves near the rail, their hats decorated with pansy wreaths. As the boat started to move they began to sing "Aloha Oe," the national song of the islands. Their voices vibrant with feeling blended magnificently. The cheering men and women hanging over the boat's rail as she moved out into the stream, the answering crowd on the pier and the farewell song rising above the sounds of the departure, formed a scene to stir the emotions.
