HYADES HERE FROM SEATTLE

After a stormy passage of eleven days from Seattle, the Matson chartered steamship Hyades arrived at her berth this morning.

In all the Hyades brought 5500 tons of miscellaneous cargo, chief amongst which were 150,000 pieces of lumber; 4370 of whale fertilizer; 6,000 sacks of feed, 5,000 packages of manure fertilizer, and fourteen head of stock composed of two blooded horses and twelve bulls for local breeding establishments.

The officers of the ship state that the weather in Seattle is miserable; nothing but rain, rain, rain, and still more rain.

After discharging her local cargo, the Hyades will leave on Friday next for Kahului and Eleie for which she has freight and at the former port take on about 4,000 tons of sugar for the homeland.

Captain John Alwen is still in command and Chief Officer William Bennett still holds down the duties of "first." The engine room is under the supervision of Chief Engineer C. E. Snyder who reports everything in his department to be working smoothly.

WHERE HUMAN RACE MULTIPLIES

Kaui is an island after ex-President Roosevelt's own heart! Among the thriving Portuguese colonists at Kalaheo there are four families with thirteen children apiece in them, who will do much to increase the strength of the county's too scanty white population. Then our newly appointed supervisor from the northern district is in the same class, it seems, as his wife has had sixteen children, ten of whom are now living. The deputy sheriff of Lihue district was presented with his thirteenth living child yesterday and his wife has borne two more that did not live. The former manager of one of the sugar plantations of the windward side of the island has a family of thirteen children, most of whom were born on Kaui, and all of whom are living. And there are others. We think that Colonel Roosevelt should award a large sized gold medal to this island.—Garden Island.

EDUCATION IN CHINA.

Professor John Fryer, head of the department of Oriental languages of the University of California, and considered one of the foremost Chinese scholars of the world, has returned to his university duties after a tour of inspection of the educational system of China. Prof. Fryer declared that the advancement of learning in China was surpassing any similar movement in the world's history. Education is considered by the Celestials, he said, far above everything else. The Chinese, he declared, would have learning, and when they have attained it in full measure, with their population and martial potentialities, they will have to be counted as the great power of the earth. In describing the situation Prof. Fryer said: "It is one of the greatest movements recorded in history. It is wonderful to see how, in only half a dozen years, it has permeated the vast Chinese Empire. High, low, rich and poor, all alike, are anxious to obtain Western learning at any cost."—Chicago Tribune.
