## LAND FRAUD SENTENCES UPHELD OAHU TO SEE ENEMIES AT NIGHT SEVEN MILES AT SEA

### Complete Census Very Important

The attention of residents of the Hawaiian Islands is called to the importance of a complete enumeration of the population. Any persons residing within the city and county of Honolulu, who have not been enumerated to date, are requested to report that fact by postal card or telephone to the head office at Honolulu.

The omission of 10 or 15 names might lower the ranking of Honolulu in the list of American cities. Territorial appropriations for road work and public improvements, and even federal appropriations, are often governed by the population of a particular district. It is to the interest of residents of every district in the Island, whether rural or urban, to have every person in their neighborhood enumerated.

### MURDER, SUICIDE AND LOVE

As a result of Yap Heu's jealousy-crazed mind, a woman named Ah Ho Ayana, and Yap Heu himself, better known as Ah Hoo, are dead, and Goo Yuen, another Chinese, is lying in the Queen's hospital with two bullet wounds which may mean death.

Early this morning Yap Heu, thinking that something was wrong with his former mistress went to the room where she had been living in one of the tenements on Fort street, just above Vineyard, and crawled along the lanai until he came to the room. Hearing voices within, he listened for a few minutes and learning that his former sweetheart was with aman. Yap Heu drew his revolver and fired five shots, snuffing out the life of the woman and seriously wounding his successful rival. The murderer then ended his own life.

Early on Saturday night Heu had tried to get the girl to come back to him, but she refused and he went away vowing to get even. The rest of the evening was spent in plotting vengeance at her place of employment on Hotel street near River in an ice cream parlor owned by a Japanese. Heu, who has been employed as janitor at the Bank of Hawaii for the past five years, went down as usual to the bank yesterday morning to clean up and during the afternoon

### CAN TELL SECRETS OF JURY

A resident of Waikiki who was just coming out of his residence for the purpose of viewing the comet was attracted by the bright flame down the road, and not being certain that it was not one of the houses along the road Ewa of Lewers road, hastened to the scene of the accident and saw that the machine was beyond all aid, as every bit of wood work was burned to ashes.

Mr. Harrub can't account for the fire as he stopped on the way in towards town to repair a part of the machinery and was seated at the wheel just ready to put in his clutch when the flames suddenly broke out and, in spite of his efforts to save it, destroyed every thing but a few tools.

### LARGE LIGHT TO BACK GREAT GUNS

Diamond Head is soon to live up to its name and flash like the diamond.

On the ragged rim of the old extinct volcano will before long be gleaming great searchlights capable of picking up ships at sea during the night at a distance of from seven to ten miles.

Following the establishment of the great mortar batteries back of the crater, where eight powerful guns are ready to blow anything within range out of the water, the United States is establishing the most powerful searchlights obtainable to give eyes to the defenders and enable them to behold whatever may attempt to creep within striking distance at night.

Two of these immense lights arrived here in the last transport from the coast, the Sheridan, and are at once to be installed, though their first office will be experimental, and their permanent stations are yet to be determined.

One will be placed, temporarily, near what is known as Carter's barn, while the other, for the time being, will be located at the south-west end, near the reservoir.

These lights carry mirrors sixty inches in diameter. The illumination is supplied by electricity, 200 amperes each, and the power generated by gasoline engines, the plant being separate from Fort Ruger's plant.

They will be operated by the fire control from a distance of two miles, the operator handling each light, moving it any direction, up or down, to the right or to the left, from the distance named.

There are more lights coming, of this kind. Some are to be stationed on Diamond Head, while others will be placed on other parts of the island, so that it will be impossible for an enemy to approach during the night without Oahu's Federal defenders picking up the vessels. The guns will do the rest.

### OREGON LAND FRAUD CONVICTIONS ARE SUSTAINED

### SMUGGLING WITNESS ADMITS HE'S LIAR

U. S. Judge Robertson, in the trial this morning of W. K. Luther, alleged opium smuggler, suggested that the attention of the Federal grand jury be brought to the discrediting of a witness, Kaikai. Kaikai on the stand admitted that he lied before U. S. Commissioner Davis.

He had some difficulty in recalling whom he had been before, but, assisted by Attorney Clem Quinn, who very neatly proved the prosecution's witness a falsifier, Kaikai finally remembered a "sassy haole" who could have been no other than Davis according to the testimony. Kaikai is serving sentence for attempted smuggling. He may yet have to serve for perjury.

### REFUSE TO DROP COMMERCE COURT

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 16.—The Senate has refused to eliminate the court of commerce provision in the railway bill. The House had stricken out of this section.

LONDON, May 16.—Colonel Roosevelt arrived here today from Berlin. He expects to remain in England about three weeks, as special United States ambassador to attend the funeral of the late King Edward, and in visiting friends. On leaving he will return to the United States. The American ex-president was received by King George, and viewed the remains of the late monarch.

### VESSEL HITS BIG FISH AND SINKS

JUNEAU, Alaska, May 16.—The whaling vessel Sorenson has been totally wrecked through collision with a monster whale near here. The captain and crew took to the boats and reached shore without mishap. The ship sunk within a few minutes.

### DR. HYDE GOES TO PRISON FOR LIFE

KANSAS CITY, May 16.—Dr. Hyde, charged with the murder of Colonel Swope, millionaire, has been found guilty as charged, and ordered to prison for life. The jury was instructed that Hyde must be found guilty of murder in the first degree or else declared innocent. Dr. Hyde's wife made a desperate fight for the liberty of her husband, declaring that there had been trickery on the part of the prosecution to convict him.

### BALLINGER FIRES HIS STENOGRAPHER

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 16.—Stenographer Kerby of the office force of the Secretary of the Interior, who made affidavit that the letter from President Taft dated September 13, exonerating Ballinger had been prepared by Assistant Attorney-General Lawler, and handed to Ballinger for approval, has been discharged in a scathing letter from Ballinger.
