FINE NIGHT FOR TENNIS AND SOME FINE PLAYING

A more suitable night than last night for tennis can hardly be imagined, and spectators and players were alike loud in their expressions of delight when the first match was commenced at the Manoa Valley Club at 7:30.

Four matches were played and interest was sustained right up to the last, the final game finishing close upon ten o'clock.

All the tournaments are now practically at the final stages, for only six matches now remain to be decided to complete the competition.

In the Mixed Doubles Mrs. Coulter and C. H. Cooke and Mrs. Clive Davies and D. W. Anderson are already through to the finals.

The Men's Singles have reached the finals, H. E. Savage, A. M. Nowell, R. A. Cooke and Atherton Richards being still left in.

Miss Lucy Ward and G. Irwin put up quite a game contest against Mrs. Coulter and Cooke last night, and won five games out of the fifteen played.

Losing the first game to love was not an auspicious opening for Mrs. Clive Davies and D. W. Anderson against Miss Paty and W. H. Babbitt, but this was more than equalized by the succeeding play as Mrs. Davies and her partner won five games right off.

A fast game, characterized by stinging drives, brilliant volleying and killing strokes, was played between G. Irwin and R. A. Cooke, but the latter had all the better of the match and won by ten to five.

Though there can be no doubt as to the effectiveness of Irwin's service as a rule, it did not pay him last night, for though he made 45 serves, only ten times did he beat Cooke and even this success was neutralized by the fact that Irwin gave six points away in double faults.
