## THE WORLD'S NEWS CONDENSED

(Special mail report to The Star from San Francisco.)

**LATEST NEWS BULLETIN.**  
(Originating on the Day the Steamer Sailed.)

Robbers looted the northbound express of the Southern Pacific in South Oregon. Dynamite was used and the mail car lifted. The passengers were not molested. The robbers escaped, but posses are in pursuit.

Gifts to the amount of \$1,200,000 have been received by Harvard University during the past year.

A millionaire who broke his glasses boarding a European steamer at New York ordered another pair by wireless of a New York store. The order was filled, the package given to an aviator who followed the steamer to sea, flew over it, and dropped the package—which just missed the vessel and fell into the sea.

The battleship Ohio, being repaired in the Brooklyn navy yard, caught fire, and 40,000 pounds of powder in the magazine were flooded to prevent an explosion. The battleship was not seriously injured by the fire.

The Liverpool, England, shipping strike has resulted in the calling out of approximately 10,000 men. Considerable shipping is tied up as a consequence.

A steam schooner rammed and sank a river steamer on the Sacramento river, used to carry sugar from Crook-

ett. No one was injured, but the boat will prove a total loss.

Miss Margaret Calhoun, daughter of Patrick Calhoun, has been married at Cleveland to Paul Foster, son of A. W. Foster, former president of the Northwestern Railroad of California, regent of the University of California and trustee of the Carnegie Educational fund.

Four Americans have been murdered by Moros in the island of Mindanao, one of the largest of the Philippine group.

Madeline McKlaskie-Brugulere-Janney has married Col. Robert F. Ames in San Francisco. Some years ago a military scandal was caused, when Elent Janney committed suicide before his wife, the present Mrs. Ames, and Col. Ames. The affair took place in the Philippines.

The Pilgrim Society of London gave a banquet to John Hays Hammond, at which former Prime Minister Balfour and Chauncey Depew gave two of the greatest speeches heard in London in years.

Senator La Follette is conceded to hold the key to the Senate situation, and he can practically dictate what the Upper House shall do.

Senators Cummins and Borah, leading the insurgent attack on reciprocity, severely scored the Senate for

submitting to dictation from the White House.

The United Railroads of San Francisco have refused to bid on any franchises under the conditions imposed by the present city charter.

At Chambers Sitting to Hear and Determine Controversies Respecting Rights of Private Ways and Water Rights.

Kaneohe Ranch Company, Limited, a Corporation, Petitioner, vs. Kaneohe Rice Mill Company, Limited, a Corporation, et al., Defendants. Action to Determine Water Rights.

You and each of you are directed to appear before the presiding judge of the Circuit Court of the First Circuit, sitting in Chambers to hear and determine controversies respecting rights of private ways and water rights, in the court room of said judge in the Judiciary Building, in Honolulu, on Saturday, the 8th day of July, 1911, at ten o'clock a. m., at which time and place a hearing on the petition filed herein by the Kaneohe Ranch Company, Limited, a corporation, against said defendants will be had, to attend and prove their rights and answer to said petition, in which petition the petitioner alleges that it is entitled, as lessee of the Konoehi of the Ahupuaa of Kaneohe, to all the water and to the use of all the water flowing in the stream which lies within and flows through the Ahupuaa of Kaneohe, in the District of Koolau-poko, City and County of Honolulu aforesaid, known as the Kaneohe stream, excepting the rights appurtenant to one hundred five and 12-1000 (105,012) acres of land in said Ahupuaa of Kaneohe for irrigation purposes not owned or leased by it, which said one hundred five and 12-1000 (105,012) acres are entitled to use not more than twenty thousand (20,000) gallons of water per acre per day for the purposes of irrigation, and proving that the rights of the parties be adjudicated and that it be adjudged that the defendants A. Haneberg, Administrator of the Estate of L. Ahlo, and the Kaneohe Rice Mill Company, Limited, are wrongfully diverting and using the said water in any amount so diverted and used exceeding twenty thousand (20,000) gallons per acre per day necessary to irrigate the portion of the said one hundred five and 12-1000 (105,012) acres owned by them, and that the petitioner be declared to be the owner, as such lessee, and entitled to the use, as such lessee, of all water of said Kaneohe stream, excepting such as is necessary to irrigate the one hundred five and 12-1000 (105,012) acres aforesaid, not exceeding twenty thousand (20,000) gallons per acre per day, and for such other and further relief as petitioner may be entitled to.

You and each of you are hereby notified that upon a failure to appear, attend and prove your rights, the same will be adjudicated without such attendance.
