present as its official representative, Henry L. Jones, assistant chief of the Latin-American division of the state department. Rear Admiral H. I. Cone, chief of the bureau of steam engineering, and Rear Admiral R. M. Wall, chief of the bureau of construction and repair, both of Washington, were also present. Among the other prominent guests were Chas. M. Schwab, Henry S. Grove, president of the Camp Shipbuilding Company; Col. A. B. Abbott, U. S. A.; Chas. G. Curtis of New York; B. D. Crowninshield, Ledy Mayer of New York, Congressman James E. Curley of Massachusetts, J. R. Gordon of New York, and other members of the Massachusetts legislature.

Following the launching, the guests gathered in the new boiler house, recently constructed, for luncheon and speech-making. Former Rear Admiral Francis T. Bowles, president of the Forz River Shipbuilding Company, presided and after toasting the newly launched battleship and her sponsor, introduced as the speakers Dr. Romulo S. De Nacion, Argentine minister to the United States; Admiral O. Betbeder, formerly the minister of marine of Argentina, and under whose administration the project of the construction of the Rivadavia was initiated; Captain Diogenes Aguirre, Germany; James M. ever innovations may be introduced will be after my return to Washington and after I have had an opportunity of studying the situation. Any innovation will take the form of a change in the method rather than in the personnel of the office here." He admitted, however, that there might be a few transfers from this point to places where the agents would fit in better. "It is the desire of the service," he added, "to take certain men and place them in positions where they will do the most good."

The Opium Ring.
Concerning the operations of the opium smuggling ring on this Coast, Wilkie seemed satisfied with the manner in which the local customs authorities are endeavoring to stamp out the traffic.

"The crusade against opium smuggling, so far as the port of San Francisco is concerned," said Wilkie, "must be conducted differently than it is on the border, for instance."

This was in answer to a question as to whether it would not be better to permit known consignments of the tabooed drug aboard incoming vessels

to be landed and thus trace them to those connected with the illegal traffic. In several cases large consignments of opium, the presence of which aboard ships was revealed in secret advices from the Orient, have been seized by the inspectors upon the arrival of the vessels.

When asked as to a report current recently to the effect that it was proposed to place all the secret service departments of the government, such as the postoffice inspectors and the agents of the investigating bureau of the Department of Justice under his supervision, he replied that there was no proposition extant looking toward that consolidation, and he did not think that there was any prospect of such a change for some time at least.


