There were some surprises sprung in the last hour of the special cash prize period, which ended at five o'clock yesterday afternoon. Shortly before this Mr. Gilliland brought in subscriptions amounting to 15,900 votes, which put him into the eighth place instead of Mrs. W. J. Payne, of Honokaa, who had held that place for some days previously with a score of 27,115.

Until a day or two ago, Miss Weight, of Wailuku, who gets third special prize, was in line for second, but she was distanced by Mr. Turrill for that place. Mr. Dias also climbed above Mr. Winkley, and secured fifth place in the special contest.

Today is the last day in which the subscriptions secured by contestants will secure the three times credit in votes. The week of this multiple count will end at eight o'clock tomorrow morning, by which time the inter-island steamers will have delivered the mails from the other islands. After that time a week of double count will begin, during which twice the regular schedule score will be allowed.

The full list of workers, with their standing to date in the big contest, will be published tomorrow.

## ONE MAN IN LUCK ON MINING DEAL

ALBANY, Ore., January 1.—Through the sale of a gold mine in California, J. Otto Lee, a member of the firm of Burkhardt & Lee, druggists of this city, has received \$100,000 on an original investment of \$500 made one and one-half years ago and expenditures since making the total investment about \$5,000. This mine is located in the Coosa mining district in Inyo County, California, and was sold to a mining syndicate for \$200,000. It was owned by the Albany man and his brother, L. W. Lee, who discovered it, each owning a one-half interest.

About one and a half years ago Mr. Lee received a letter from his brother, whom he had not heard from for six years, informing him that the latter had located a claim in California which offered a good prospect. He offered his Albany brother a one-half interest in the claim for \$500.

Lee had lost a few hundred dollars in two different mining ventures, and

hesitated about trying his chances, but finally sent his brother \$500. This amount proved insufficient for the necessary development, but the work it accomplished disclosed a better prospect, and Lee later sent more money. He made a trip to California a few months ago to look at the mine and found it so good that he decided to furnish all necessary money to develop the claim to show fully what it contained.

Recently a mining syndicate began investigating the mine, and Lee received word yesterday that the mine had been sold for \$200,000.

## GIVE SUPERVISING PRINCIPALS WORK

When the school commissioners met last night at eight o'clock they took steps to give the supervising principals of the different districts much more power than they had before, under the old rules. Commissioner Alken introduced the resolution which read as follows:

"Resolved, That the supervising principals shall hold a regular annual meeting each year in Honolulu, just prior to the summer meeting of the commissioners of public instruction, for the consideration and discussion of various educational problems and to formulate recommendations thereon.

"School principals and teachers may send in suggestions for consideration at these meetings and may be present at these meetings and may be present to take part in the discussion by invitation.

"In case of a minority vote on any subject under discussion, minority reports shall receive due consideration by the commissioners.

"The questions to be discussed and voted upon at these meetings may include the following:

"(a) Changes and adoption of text books.

"(b) Changes in course of study and their adoption.

"(c) Changes in the form of principals' reports.

"(d) Changes in the forms of supervising principals' reports and in the work required of them.

"(e) Changes desired in the methods of instructions and training in the Honolulu Normal School of cadets destined to come under their supervision.

"(f) Any and all other matters relating to the proper conduct of the schools of the Territory."

The resolution was carried and in future the supervising principals will have much more power.




