DE MELLO'S DEFEAT OF KUPA BOOSTS PORTUGUESE'S STOCK

The news of the Hilo battle between Ben de Mello and "Jaw-breaker" Kupa has aroused interest in the coming bout between de Mello and Jim Hoao to a remarkable degree.

The Portuguese is regarded as a wonder of stamina by his countrymen in Honolulu on account of his coming back from a practical knock-out and turning the tables on his aggressive opponent.

Had Kupa beaten de Mello last Saturday night the latter's reputation in Honolulu might not have amounted to much.

Arrangements will probably be made for de Mello to spar tomorrow afternoon and Friday at the Marine camp.

MEYER SURE STAR SPRINTER

By covering 100 meters in 19 3-5 seconds at an indoors meet a few nights ago, Alvah T. Meyer, representing the Irish-American Club of New York, bettered by one-fifth of a second the world's record held jointly by James Rector and Reggie Walker in the London Olympic of 1908.

Six watches timed Meyer and five agreed on his record performance. Meyer is the sensation of the athletic season around the Metropolitan district and is touted by the experts to equal 9 2-5 seconds between now and the time of the Olympic games.

Bernie Wefers, one of America's greatest sprinters in the late 80s, in speaking of Meyer's showing, says: "Meyer is truly a wonderful runner

and unless the unforeseen occurs, I look for him to beat the best time for the century. He is just the caliber of a sprinter America needs to trim our foreign competitors in the Swedish games this summer.

"Meyer first attracted attention around New York last fall when he commenced to win from the best of the local short distance runners. In September he won the hundred at the Canadian championships in ten seconds.

EDINBURGH, February 3.—William Longboat, the Canadian Indian runner, today won a fifteen-mile race at the Powder Hall Athletic Grounds, defeating Kohlemalner, the Finnish champion, who recently won the professional marathon foot race, and Hans Holmer, the American runner, by half a yard and 200 yards respectively. Longboat's time for the distance was 1h. 20m. 4 2-5 s. The prize was \$375.
