Some extracts from a London letter are interesting, and may seem disquieting. There is no reason to suppose that the writer has greatly overdrawn the picture.



CITY OF MEXICO, April 14.—Several hundred foreigners in Mexico City have petitioned Great Britain to intercede in Mexican affairs for the sake of peace and their own safety.
