USEFUL PLANTS.—The number of known useful plants is estimated at 12,000. Of these there are no less than 2,500 known economic plants, among which are 1,100 edible fruits, berries and seeds, 60 cereals, 200 roots and tubers, 27 onions, 420 vegetables and salads, 40 palms, 32 varieties of arrowroot, and 24 sugars. Various drinks are obtained from 200 plants, and aromatics from 226. There are 50 substitutes for coffee, and 129 for tea. Tannin is present in 14 plants, catechu in 36, galls in 10, grease and essential oils in 80; 88 plants contain starch, soda and iodine, 650 contain dyes, 47 contain 250 dyes which serve for weaving, and 44 for paper making; 48 dye materials for roofing, 100 are employed for building and coppers, 740 are used in building, and 616 are known to be poisonous.
