The lark CELSTIA, which arrived on Sunday last, had a good passage, bringing San Francisco papers to January 5th, and Eastern telegrams three days later than the Idaho.

The steamer Idaho sailed on Monday last for San Francisco, taking a fine freight of about 200 tons, but only sixteen passengers.

We observe that the China steamer which arrived at San Francisco several days behind time, and failed to connect with the Panama steamer.

The lark CELSTIA, which arrived on Sunday last, had a good passage, bringing San Francisco papers to January 5th, and Eastern telegrams three days later than the Idaho.

has received the taxes due subsequent to the time appointed for making his last return. There is nothing in this law that restricts the number of voters simply to those who have paid their taxes before December 25th or any date in December.

The ruling, therefore, by which the Inspectors of elections restrict the number of legal voters to such only as have paid their taxes before the 25th or 31st of December, has no legal support whatever, and is in direct violation of the Constitution, which declares that "every male subject of the Kingdom who shall have paid his taxes, shall be entitled to one vote for the representatives of that district."

We do not wish to charge the inspectors with any design to defraud the people of the rights properly belonging to them, nor with any lack of competency for the duties of their office; but one thing is certain that the manner in which the registration in 1886 was conducted, did abridge the rights of the people, and restricted the number of votes cast in Honolulu to less than 250 out of a total of three thousand eligible voters in the district.

It is interesting to watch the changes going on in the politics of the various countries of Europe and America. Mexico is quietly resuming her former republican status; the United States slowly but effectually recognizing her lately rebellious sections; England is convulsed with alarm at the threats of the Fenians; Italy wants Rome, but dares not touch it; France is evidently arming and placing herself in an attitude to fight if compelled to do so.

In England, the Fenian excitement is increasing to such an extent as threatens to create serious trouble. This state of things has been increased by the execution of the Manchester rioters, which has exasperated the Irish generally.

The execution of Allen, and Larkin, and Gould is the most important reinforcement that Fenianism has received, and the cause now stands no more as a martyr; now it has three. The people had very nearly lost confidence in their leaders; they had ceased in a measure to give their earnings for propaganda campaigns, and their indignation against rebellion was dividing down into a sort of guerrilla warfare, sustained only by the most desperate and desperate of their number.

Regarding the Prussian trouble with Holstein, which led to war a few years since, a correspondent, who has been traveling in Prussia and Denmark, writes us as follows: "The Prussian king, who is a martyr; now it has three.
