The field trials of tillage implements lasted a week, under scorching weather all the time, and watched by large numbers of agricultural and other spectators. The horse-drawn ploughs have been through the most severe ordeal that they have ever known. The judges have taken the greatest possible care and pains, intently watching every furrow, measuring and testing the work with rule, square, and level, clearing away the cut soil for an examination of the unmoved bottom, taking by draftand construction of each seclected plough. And, moreover, the condition of the ground has been such that no second-rate tool could possibly gloss over a piece of work that might be pleasing to the eye, but wanting in soundness of execution. The result of the preliminary, second, and final trials has been to give Messrs. James and Frederick Howard, of Bedford, the lion's share of the honours; Messrs.
