THE HAWAIIAN FISH-HAWK.

The Hawaiian Fish-Hawk, belonging to the genus which includes the Ospreys of America, England and India, is exceedingly rare.

I cannot easily forget the occasion of the first and only time in which I ever saw one of these birds alive. During a boat trip which I made several years ago between the islands of Kaula and Nihoa, after passing the night on the water without wind, and having made but moderate progress with the oars, we took the trade just after sunrise, and in a little while rounded the lofty and picturesque promontory that makes the most southerly point of Nihoa, and wearing to the right, skirted the south-western shore of the island, a wild and desolate shore, rock-bound, yet torn and jagged and scarred, as if the volcanic forces in their last terrible throes had exhausted their mightiest strength and left their own sign-manual forever legible in the tumbled and billowy ledges of blackened lava, against which the ocean flung its waves in ceaseless thunders.
