The Hawaiians an Oceanic Race—No. 3.

Whenever I recur to the origin of the Hawaiians, proofs multiply and crowd upon me that they are not from the west.

They are small, yellow people, with flat noses, high cheek bones, slight beards, speaking a language original in its character, and distinct from the Malay.
