While the principal civilized nations of the world will be fully represented in this grand exhibition, it is interesting to learn that Japan, which has so recently emerged from her jealous seclusion, has demanded a large space for the display of her products...

Respecting to the published invitation of Dr. Hoffmann, the Consul for Austria, Messrs. H. Hoffmann & Co., as agents for several plantations, have kindly procured samples of the principal articles of produce of the islands for this exhibition...

Photographers and other artists of this city have contributed views of Hawaiian scenery, volcanoes, public buildings, etc. The kindness of some of our ladies has added fine articles of real Hawaiian manufacture, such as women's and men's hats, mats, etc., and Dr. Hoffmann has furnished other native handicraft, such as poi dishes and other specimens of our ornamental woods; fine kapas; dried ferns from Hawaii; patterns of canoes made from sandal-wood; a copy of Andrews' Hawaiian Dictionary; native newspapers; and bound volumes of the PACIFIC COMMERCIAL ADVERTISER, for 1870-72. A good sample of guano from the islands of the Phoenix Group Company is also forwarded, which, though not a product of these islands, comes from a source not very remote from us, and is of no little importance to Hawaii, as it is of considerable amount for supplies and laborers.

If all those partially enumerated articles should occur every so small a space in that Grand Exhibition of the World's Industries, we hope to have from Vienna at least that Hawaii is not kindly noticed, and that the efforts of Dr. Hoffmann are appreciated.

For ourselves, we take pleasure in announcing that we shall be represented at the Universal Exhibition by an able special correspondent, who will from time to time give our readers an account of this great world's gathering.

OUR NEAR neighbor the Gazette, of the 13th, takes occasion to comment editorially upon the delay of His Honor the Police Magistrate, in rendering a decision in the case of the King vs. a string of names over seven inches long, popularly known as "the hula case," and with all the emphasis that belongs to its position as a Reliable Government Organ, (we mean a Reliable Organ of the Government) calls upon His Honor to render judgment in the case, in a reasonable period.

Now we call this man. Here is the official motto-piece of the Government, the foremost exponent of Government opinion, and offspring of Government patronage, coolly firing in the rear upon a hapless fellow who happens to have "doubts" as to the interpretation of a certain law in a certain case, and takes a little time in which to consider, before rendering a judgment that is the Gazette says will be important. Hereafter His Honor has had no difficulty in disposing of such matters, and so forth with ought, according to the Gazette, to snap out the sentence, bundle off the whole seven inches of names to the jail, or reef, or Molokai, or wherever he has been in the habit of sending parties guilty of holding "hula parties or dances" without a license. Go to, Mr. Gazette! we never move to have any unlicensed fun without raising doubts as to what shall be the punishment? Because thou hast grown virtuous, shall there be no more cakes and ale?

We consider that His Honor the Police Magistrate is only exercising a sound discretion in pondering long ere he gives judgment in this case. We admire his sagacity in taking it home with him, sleeping over it, turning the whole matter over in his mind during the silent hours of night, and in having it "called before him again on the 7th, 11th and 14th," far by so doing, he is sure to arrive at some conclusion or other, and thus hasten the time when the public will understand what is actually the law of the land, - as far as he is concerned. But this is shocking hypocrisy on your part, Mr. Gazette, in promptly demanding a speedy decision: 'twould have been perfectly consistent with our "irresponsibility," "mendacity," "arrogance," "impudence," and general independence; but for you, the Government Organ, whose business it is to wheeze out non-committal platitudes and "by authority" notices, "tis too much," as Artemus Ward said when eight female Mormons claimed him as their affinity. We consider too that it is mean in you to thus sharpen up the horns of the sufficiently uncomfortable dilemma in which His Honor is placed, and doubly mean in poaching on our preserves, coming in as you do, and bagging the game that we have winged.

We wish that there was some law touching upon the sifting of ideas, for then we could have you up before His Honor, and see if you would then bow for an "early judgment" in the case. We rather think not.

Anything that will add to the number and value of our exports should receive every possible encouragement. We believe in Government offering premiums for this purpose. The amount appropriated by the last Legislature for the "Encouragement of Agriculture," was but small, - only \$3,000 for two years, - but even that amount, judiciously expended in premiums would have an immediate effect in prompting agricultural effort.

There is the Ramie, a valuable article for export, now ascertained to be well suited for cultivation especially on Hawaii - a moderate reward offered for a machine that will expeditiously and thoroughly clean the fibre, would be money well expended. We notice that Mr. H. M. Whitney has manifested his enterprise by offering a premium of \$100 in coin to the person who will grow and deliver to him on the island of Hawaii, a quantity of good Ramie, for which he will pay six cents per pound in the seed, or twenty cents if grown in the position of sea island cotton (the only sort grown here) in past years amounted to from 15,000 to 20,000 pounds in a single year, but the native grower, through ignorance and carelessness, continued to pick successive crops from the same tree, instead of cutting them down at the end of the season and planting new ones. The consequence was that the quality of the cotton deteriorated, and the price fell for the Hawaiian article in the foreign markets. Trees should be cut down at the end of the second year, at farthest.

These two articles for export, Ramie and Cotton, if properly prepared in a merchantable shape, will always command a good price and ready sale in the markets of the world. They require the possession of no great amount of capital to be produced; they both grow luxuriantly here; and we hope and expect to see them figure extensively hereafter in our list of exports.
