TWO WEEKS LATER!

ARRIVAL OF THE MURRAY!

Prospective Termination of the Virginian Affair.

By the arrival on Wednesday morning of the bark D. C. Murray, Captain Fuller, 15 days from San Francisco, we have dates from that port to December 29th.

At two o'clock this morning the following important despatch was received from Washington. It definitely settles our difficulty with Spain, as far as it is in the power of the Castellan Government.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29. A.—A Despatch deciding the grave question whether there should be peace or war between the United States and Spain was received by Mr. Fish to-night and communicated to the Cabinet.

At the close of the Cabinet meeting, which was not so long as the former ones on the same question, nothing had been received here from the Spanish Government, which had asked for a delay until twelve o'clock to-day, as whether Mr. Siskiele had withdrawn from Madrid in obedience to his instructions, is also not known.
