KAUAI CORRESPONDENCE.

A LOUINGER'S NOTES—HANAIE AS IT WAS AND AS IT IS.

A change we have found there, and many a change, faces and footprints and all things strange.

Those who were wont to visit Hanaie some eight or ten years ago to enjoy its quiet beauty and breathe its sweet air, would now be surprised to see the changes which have taken place there.

A like change has also come over the Hanaie valley. We were accustomed to see only sugar canes waving in the breeze, now nearly the whole of this beautiful valley is in the possession of Chinese, who are raising heavy crops of rice, and a large pasturage with hundreds of fine cattle, horses and mules feeding thereon.

There are only a very few white men to be seen around Hanaie now-days, and none of its former foreign families.

The natives too are not so numerous, many have died while yet young, and some have also gone away to other parts.

During my stay at Hanaie the wheels of time brought round the glorious Fourth and from something which had appeared in one of the native newspapers, the contract laborers on the plantations were under the impression that the day was a legal holiday for them and when the hour for starting work arrived they were surprised to find the natives put in an appearance.

SUPREME COURT.

BEFORE FIRST ASSOCIATE JUSTICE JUDG. Friday, July 9th.

CIVIL CASES—HAWAIIAN JURY.

Napukaia (w) vs. Nahua (w). Ejectment. By leave of the Court Mr. Dole, counsel for the plaintiff, amended the declaration by adding the name of Kuawaa (k) to the record, he having been married to Napukaia since the commencement of the suit.

Kopa (k) Administrator of the Estate of Mose Mahoe, deceased, vs. Ohia. Mr. Preston for the plaintiff, and Mr. Bickerton for the defence. A jury was empaneled and a large number of witnesses were examined.

Divorce Cases. The following cases were called, and dismissed for non-attendance, viz:—Kaukanis (k) vs. Niupo (w); Kealaula (k) vs. Kapa (w).

Auhaa (w) vs. Kanaepelua (k). In this case Mr. Hartwell appeared for the libellant. The respondent was charged with adultery, intemperance and cruelty. He appeared in Court without counsel, and said he had no money and no property, real or personal.

being satisfied from the evidence adduced that the respondent had been guilty of adultery granted the divorce.

Puhulama (w) vs. Kaili (k). In this case the husband was charged with desertion. Mr. W. L. Holokahiki appeared for the libellant. Her case was proved, and divorce granted.

Monday, July 11th. The Civil cases before Hawaiian juries were commenced and continued on the following day. We shall give our report of these next week.

Thursday, 14th July. CRIMINAL CASES—FOREIGN JURY.

The King vs. Kong Sing. The prisoner was charged with burglary and was undefended. After the evidence against him had been taken, he made a statement in defence to the effect that Maikai, one of the witnesses, had asked him to procure liquor for him, which he refused to do; that Maikai then asked him to come to his house. He went with him and Maikai offered him \$2 to buy liquor, which he again refused. Then Maikai said if he would not get him the liquor he would hand in upon him and say that he had been stealing in his house.

The King vs. Louis Dubois. Embezzlement. When this case was called Mr. Dole, defendant's counsel, moved that he be discharged from custody, inasmuch as, by the demise of the late Chief Justice of the Court, and the failure to fill the vacancy thereby caused, there is at the present time no Supreme Court.

The hearing of the case against L. Dubois was continued, occupying the whole day. The jury returned a unanimous verdict of acquittal.

Island Notes.

The rainfall at Kilanea, Kauai, was for April, 2.64 ins.; May, 4.73 ins.; June 6.35.

On Saturday July 2d. the following notice was posted in prominent places in Hilo, and on Sunday it was read in the churches, viz:

In view of the danger impending this part of the Island from the lava flow, it is hereby recommended, that on Wednesday the 6th day of July, all places of business in the town and district of Hilo, be closed from 11 A. M. until 3 P. M., and that all persons who believe in an Almighty God, look to him, especially on that day, and so far as practicable, assemble in their several places of worship for that purpose, if so be He may be pleased to avert the threatening calamity, or prepare us for the result.

In response to this call meetings were held, in the morning at the Native Church, and at noon, in the Foreign Church, in each of which about thirty persons assembled.

Returning to Hilo I was much surprised to find the lava had made such rapid progress. Hilo people have not had cause to be alarmed. I know of nothing to prevent its overwhelming the town. I presume the reports received in Honolulu per last steamer gave full particulars.

We learn that the Rev. Mr. Baker of the English Church at Hilo, inspired by a worthy catholic spirit, called upon the Catholic Priest, Rev. C. Pouzet, and representing to him the feeling of Protestant Christians of the town that prayer should be offered to Almighty God to avert a threatening calamity, requested that the Rev. Father and his parishioners unite in a common supplication.
