LATE NEWS.

We clip the following from papers received by recent arrivals.

London, March 10.—The Russian Nihilists have decided to abandon the policy of assassination... London, March 10.—In the House of Commons today, Mr. Courtenay, Under-Secretary to the Colonies, in reply to a question, stated that the Queensland Government had not asked permission to introduce Indian coolies into the colony.

New York, March 10.—An avalanche has occurred in the State of Nevada. An enormous body of snow came down from the mountains, overwhelming in its course, a number of dwellings. So far as is at present known eighteen lives have been lost.

Berlin, March 18.—During the visit which he paid to the Berlin Academy today, the Emperor slipped as he was descending the staircase, and fell heavily. His Majesty was somewhat severely bruised, and is now confined to his room.

St. Louis, March 12.—The water spout on the whole river is Milligan's bend. There is an overflow and a counter-flow in that district. The waters from the Mississippi are going over the levee, and the flow again in the water course Yazo are coming in from behind. As a consequence, when these two bodies meet, a whirlpool is formed, which destroys everything in its course.

March 20.—Telegrams to hand from Tunis report that the relations between the French and Italian residents in that country have assumed a decidedly hostile phase, and that constant attacks are taking place in the city of Tunis, and other towns between the two classes.

Amsterdam, March 20.—It is rumored that an exhibition will be held at Hague next year, chiefly for the display of colonial exhibits. All European States have decided to exhibit, and have appointed committees to carry out the representation at the exhibition.

London, March 22.—Telegrams are to hand from the Transvaal announcing that the native tribes in the south-west are now in open rebellion against the Boers, and that a severe engagement has been fought in the district. The latter were defeated with considerable loss.

Auckland, March 27.—The royal barge ordered by the Tongan Government for presentation to King George was launched today. It is 20 feet long, has 8 feet beam, and cost nearly \$1000. She is painted white with a gold streak on the outside, while the inside is got up in luxurious style.

Melbourne, March 23.—A great sensation has been caused in Melbourne by the publication in the Age of a documentary proof that the recent visit of the Russian Pacific fleet to Australia was undertaken with the express object of ascertaining the character of the part defenses of the chief colonial cities.
