SHIPPING NOTES. The Iwalani brought 3378 bags sugar, 38 green hides, 30 bags rice, 6 calves, and 25 head cattle from Kaula.

The C R Bishop brought 2339 bags sugar, and 20 dry hides from Hamakua. She towed in the British barkentine Mount Lebanon.

The stmr Kinana Hou brought 608 bags and 27 kegs sugar, 99 bags kolo, 25 bags charcoal, and 27 bales wool from Kaula.

The American Steamship Mariposa, Capt Thos Golding, arrived about 6 o'clock yesterday morning.

The Malolo brought 900 bags sugar from Laupahoehoe.

The bkine Ella, Capt E M Howe, sails to-morrow with about 800 bags sugar for San Francisco.

The stmr Mokolii is having its davits repaired and bulwarks repaired. Will sail to-morrow.

The bk Atlanta is still anchoring off port.

The bkine Mount Lebanon was hauled alongside Brewer's wharf yesterday. She is consigned to a Chinese firm, Sing, Chong & Co.

The Abbie Carver was moved out in the stream yesterday.

The following vessels are expected here from Puget Sound with lumber: Terns Hueneke, Eva, Excelsior, John Anderson, and bkine Kikikati.

The Nettie Merrill brought 900 bags sugar from Lahaina. She made the round trip in three days.

The bark Atlanta anchored off port yesterday; her draught prevented her from entering at low tide, though the Mokolii was sent out for her.

The steam tug Pele has for a second time been laid up for repairs, she having sprung another leak in her boiler.

The stmr Kinana Hou will leave at 6 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon, a great advantage to visitors to the raees.

The bkine Discovery, Capt W R Perriman, leaves to-morrow at 2 p.m. for San Francisco with 2227 bags rice and 10,879 bags sugar.

The schr Keahuaholi brought 375 bags sugar, 21 kegs molasses and 23 bales wool from Hanalei. She made the round trip within six days.

The Mokolii brought 325 bags rice, 200 bags sugar, and 26 sks bran from Koolau and Laie.

The Waioli brought 364 bags sugar from Haiku.

The Waiman brought 89 bags sugar, 100 kegs molasses, 39 bags rice from Koloa.

The Ehuakai brought 486 bags sugar, 32 green hides, 3000 oranges, 50 bbls molasses from Waialua.

The Am schooner Ida Schaner, Captain Williams, arrived at Kaula last Tuesday, 25 days from Eureka, with 21,000 railroad ties for the Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar Co.

The schr Emma brought 824 bags paddy and 618 bags sugar from Lisela.

The Am bkine Ella, Capt E M Howe, sailed on the 12th instant for San Francisco with 14 cabin passengers, 6414 bags sugar, weighing 4413 tons, and 700 gallons molasses, making a total value of \$38,485.70.

The schr Kaulikeonui brought 2318 bags of sugar from Kohala. Will sail next Monday.

The day for the sailing of the bark Abbie Carver for Hongkong has been fixed for Monday next.

The three-masted schooner Emma Clandina, Capt Matson, arrived at Hilo, last Monday, 16 days from San Francisco.

A sailor belonging to the Swiftsure, while sitting in the steam launch yesterday, which was lying close to the vessel, had his leg broken by being crushed against the vessel. He was brought ashore and taken to the hospital.

The British steamship City of Paris, Captain G. Lochead, arrived in port yesterday morning, 75 days from Liverpool, 65 days from St. Michaels, and 22 days from Corouel. She brought 863 Portuguese immigrants. There were 60 deaths during the voyage and 10 births.

The bark C O Whitmore will sail early next week for Port Townsend.

The steamer Lenua was unable to load sugar at Kipahulu this trip, on account of the heavy seas. There were over a thousand bags of sugar awaiting shipment there. The Lenua returned yesterday without a cargo.

The steamer James Makee was delayed yesterday two hours after the usual time waiting for passengers who were at the fair.

The flags of the various vessels in the harbor were displayed at half-mast yesterday in memory of the late Mr. G. J. Emmes.

The steamer Planter brought 4845 bags of sugar, 254 bags of wax, 13 bags of coffee, 214 packages of miscellaneous merchandise, 25 head cattle, 102 sheep, and 3 horses from Maui and Hawaii.
