Prices of Blooded Cattle.

Those who are interested in handling blooded cattle and their offspring, and many others who profit by the present means of disseminating high-priced stock, will be glad to read the following resume of the season's sale in the States from the columns of the Breeder's Gazette, Lexington, Ky.

While the statement, strictly speaking, refers only to those animals that came under the hammer of a public sale, yet it gives a fair estimate from which to calculate the sales of each breed and the rapidity with which they are being disseminated throughout the country.

In this communication it may be remarked that the Islands of Jersey and Guernsey have stringent laws forbidding the importation of cattle, the object being to prevent the contamination of those superb island breeds. In 1789 a law was passed forbidding the importation of any cow, heifer, bull or calf, under a penalty of 200 livres, and the forfeiture of boat and tackle.
