**The Fort Leavenworth Monument to General Grant.**

To the People of Kansas:

The undersigned have been appointed a committee to solicit subscriptions for the erection of a monument on the Fort Leavenworth Military Reservation to the memory of General Ulysses S. Grant.

This monument has the co-operation of the State authorities and people of the States of Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa, Colorado, Texas and Arkansas, and the Territories of New Mexico and Arizona, as well as the officers and soldiers of the United States Army in this Department.

It is believed that the erection of a monument on the Fort Leavenworth Reservation is peculiarly fitting and appropriate. This reserve belongs to the Nation. There all the regiments Kansas sent to the war were organized and equipped. It is a beautiful spot, and all of the memories clustering around it are associated with the life and services of the Great Commander of our armies.

We confidently appeal to the people of Kansas for subscriptions to aid in the erection of this proposed monument. We appeal to the soldiers residing in Kansas to aid in doing honor to the memory of their illustrious General. We appeal to the loyal people of Kansas to unite in the effort to build a monument that will fittingly testify the love and respect they feel for the man whose genius led the armies of loyalty to final victory.

It is proposed that, in all cases where a fund is raised by any body of citizens, civic, military or religious, as by the Grand Army, the schools, any religious organization, the railroad employes, etc., this fact shall be specially acknowledged in a memorial stone bearing a suitable inscription, placed in the proposed monument.

The undersigned hereby appoint the County Clerk, Treasurer and Sheriff of each county in the State, as a committee to solicit funds for the monument from the citizens generally. Such committees are authorized to appoint all necessary sub-committees, in the cities, towns and townships within the several counties. We also designate the Post Commander, Adjutant and Quartermaster of each Grand Army Post within the State, as a committee to solicit and receive subscriptions. We further appeal to the pastors of all churches, and to the teachers of all schools in the State, to designate some day when subscriptions will be taken up by them for the Grant Monument Fund.

All the moneys collected should be transmitted to Captain M. H. Insley, Leavenworth, Kansas, who has been appointed Treasurer of the State Committee.

Captain F. H. Hathaway, Assistant Quartermaster, U. S. A., Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, has been appointed Secretary of the State Committee, and will furnish the committees and persons above designated with all necessary subscription papers and circulars.
