Kansas City Market Report.
Kansas City Stock Yards, July 16, 1907.

Cattle in the native division are holding the advance secured last week, and fed cattle of all kinds are selling at the top prices of the year this week. Dry lot steers reached \$7.00 today, and range from \$6.35 to \$7.00. Cows and heifers have not been up to requirements for a week, although the embargo against the packers has been removed more than a week now, prices are up 10 to 25 cents as compared with a week ago. In the quarantine division liberal supplies have arrived, but buyers took them at higher prices all of last week. Yesterday there was a break of 10 to 15 cents on quarantine grass steers, and the opening today was weak, but late sales were on a firm basis, and demand strong. Grass cattle have not been coming very freely to the native division, as pastures are in fine condition, and cattle doing well. Prices on grass steers are higher than a week ago, a situation contrary to precedent, for at this season the market is generally slipping downwards. Corn fed grass steers are slightly lower than a week ago, buyers being disposed to push them far into the straight grass class, sales at \$5.72 to \$6.50, grass steers at \$4.50 to \$5.20, cown \$2.50 to \$4.75, heifers \$3.50 to \$5.75, a few choice heifers this week at \$6.00, and steers and heifers mixed at \$6.35. Veals are 50 cents higher than last week, at \$5 to \$7, bulls \$2.75 to \$4.50. Trade in country grades has been slow and prices lower because of the absence of buyers, who were kept at home doing urgent farm work. The outlook is better this week, and prices have recovered part of the 25 to 50 cents loss sustained last week, stockers selling at \$3.25 to \$4.75, feeders \$3.75 to \$4.90.

Liberal receipts of hogs and growing independence of packers, who have been putting away meat for some time, remove most of the support from the hog market, and prices are gradually declining. Run is 15,000 head today, market a shade stronger, top \$5.95, bulk of sales \$5.80 to \$5.90. Heavy hogs sell at \$5.70 to \$5.90 today, and opinion favors still wider difference between them and lightweights. However, local prices are highest on the river, and shippers generally pretty well satisfied with sales, as the market has not been affected by any radical changes.

Mutton receipts are smallest of the season, only 18,000 here last week, and 2,000 today. Prices are firmer than a week ago, market up 10 cents today, top lambs \$7.70, wethers and yearlings worth \$5.50 to \$6.00, ewes \$5.25 to \$5.50 for native stock. Small offerings from the range are likely to come for the next several weeks.

On July 1st the price of stamped envelopes will be increased four cents a thousand. At present one thousand stamped two cent envelopes cost \$21.20. The price after June 30 will be \$21.24. A package of 25 envelopes now cost 53 cents. The new price will be 54 cents. On this date the postoffice department will begin the issue of stamped envelopes and newspaper wrappers with embossed postage of a new design in four denominations—one, two four and five cents. It would be well for those who send souvenir post cards to remember that cards bearing particles of glass, metal, mica, sand tinsel or other similar substances, are unmailable, and are sent to the dead letter office unless enclosed in an envelope, or so secured that the substances will not rub off when handled by mail clerks.

Fouts & Hadlock have on exhibition a contrivance for wetting the sickle bar of McCormick mowers, which attracts much attention from alfalfa raisers. A two gallon can containing water is perched on the tongue of the machine close to the driver's seat and is connected by a short section of rubber hose to the apparatus which distributes the fluid along the sickle bar in such a way that the sickle is kept constantly wet enough to prevent being clogged by "gum" as the combination of alfalfa juice and dust is designated by the farmers. It is a very handy contrivance, as the quantity of water used is easily regulated by the driver without leaving his seat.—Osborne Farmer.
