Nettie Mariah Williams was born at Colfax, Jasper county, Iowa, on February 5, 1869. She came with her mother, brother and sister to Phillips county, Kansas, the fall of 1878; from there they moved to Barton-co., in 1886. She was married to W. A. Sandreth in June, 1888, to which union was born her only child, Rosella, who survive her. She united with the Methodist church of Vinegar Hill at the age of 20, of which she was a very efficient worker.

In October, 1900, she was married to F. H. Hoisington in Nebraska. While there she united with the Presbyterian church, of which she has been a member ever since, but was formally received by letter here at the Saline Valley school house. She was one of the leaders in the organization of that Sunday school, being superintendent of the same about seven months.

After an illness of ten weeks she passed to the great beyond at 9:55 o'clock on the morning of June 23rd, 1910. She leaves a mother, brother, sister, husband and daughter to mourn her loss, together with a host of friends and neighbors. The funeral services were held at the Methodist church Friday afternoon.
