### SCHOOL MEETING

Wa-Keeney, Kans., April 11, 1913.

The annual school meeting of district No. 1 was held in the school building, Friday, April 11th, 1913.

Director C. L. Hardman in the chair, all members of the board being present. Meeting called to order at 2 p. m. by the chairman.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 12, 1912, were read and approved as read.

The annual report of District Treasurer, W. W. Gibson, and District Clerk, J. W. Phares were read and showed a balance on hand at this date of \$4630.10.

On motion the following committee was appointed to audit the report and accounts of the treasurer, viz: R. C. Wilson, I. T. Purcell and Chas. Hille. The committee made their report, showing that they found the reports and accounts to be correct as read and approved the same. On motion the report was accepted and the committee discharged.

On motion the nomination for director for the ensuing term, C. L. Hardman was placed in nomination, by R. C. Wilson, and there being no further nomination Mr. Hardman was unanimously elected by acclamation and so declared by the clerk.

On motion it was voted to have nine month school.

On motion it was voted to raise \$3500 for general school purposes for the ensuing year.

A motion to add a Manual training department to the school, brought on a general discussion, after which the motion was amended and the Board was ordered to investigate the proposition, and if possible to add such a course, to call a special meeting at some later date, for the purpose of finally deciding whether said Manual Course shall be added or not. On motion the meeting adjourned sine die.

## COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Wa-Keeney, Kan., April 7, 1913.

The board of commissioners met today in regular session at the office of the county clerk. Members present were: John McNaughton, chairman, A. H. Hamm, S. A. Newcomer, commissioners; S. M. Hutzel, county attorney; and the county clerk. The board remained in session the 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th, taking a recess from day to day.

The following bonds were approved: Trego County State bank, Collyer State bank, Ogallah State bank, David Carr Justice of the Peace, Reinhart Haug Justice of the Peace.

Resignation of Dr. O. A. McDonald as County Physician and Health Officer was accepted. Claim of Wm. Polkowsky for refund of \$7.93 for erroneous assessment on personal property was allowed.

Warrant was issued to county clerk for \$90 for maintenance of C. Cornelson family for quarter ending June 31 1913, to be paid as follows 15 dollars the 1st and 15th of each month.

The board presented a bill to the Trego County High School Trustees for a refund of \$276.90. Balance due Trego county for salaries paid High School trustees. The bill was allowed and paid.

Dr. W. Y. Herrick was appointed health officer for the remaining three quarters of this year and to receive for his services \$250. Payable quarterly.

The board approved recommendation of J. H. Nelsley and Mrs. Eva P. Jones as members of the county teachers examining board beginning May 1st, 1913.

Reports of county treasurer and county superintendent were read and approved as read as were also the reports of fees of the county treasurer, clerk of the district court, register of deeds, county attorney, probate judge and sheriff.

The following resolutions were adopted by the board:

Be it resolved by the county commissioners, that from and after the 10th day of April 1913 the county will not be liable for or assume or pay any claims incurred by any county officer or other person except the same be approved by the county clerk unless otherwise provided by statute.
