

Military Movements in Missouri.

St. Louis, June 15. Arrangements have been made, by which dispat-

Two companies of cavalry accompany Gen. Lyon's expedition to Jefferson, and Col. Siegel's command on the South-West Branch of the Pacific Railroad.

Officers of the Missouri river steamers, who arrived to-day, say the impression prevailed that Governor Jackson would make the first stand at Boonville. Cannon and shot had been transferred from Jefferson City, and preparations had been made for resistance at that point.

Rumors are current that the State Convention is soon to be called together. A. W. Morrison, State Treasurer, was arrested yesterday at Washington, on his way to Jefferson City, but was released after a brief detention.

The Evening News learned from a gentleman, just from Fort Smith, Arkansas, that Ben. McCulloch is there at the head of 10,000 troops many of them Cherokee Indians, well armed and mounted on mustang ponies, and ready to march into Missouri at a given signal. This news needs confirmation.

Eight regiments of Illinois troops are to be stationed within two hours march of St. Louis, 4 at Butterville, and 4 at Caseyville Camp. Four regiments will also be stationed at Quincy.

We have no doubt information that there were 2,000 State troops at Boonville, half of them armed and disciplined, with quite a number of cannon. Entrenchments are being made up and troops are constantly arriving.

The secessionists have full sway in all the Counties along both sides of the Missouri river from Kansas border to Boonville, and the indications are that they are pretty well prepared for fight.

The report of a skirmish near Independence in which the Federal troops were repulsed seems to have some probability, but the telegraph in that region is entirely under control of secessionists and reliable reports cannot be obtained.

The Democrat issued an extra this afternoon containing correspondence of the military expedition up the Missouri river, and a dispatch from Jefferson City, announcing the arrival of the steamers Itan and J. C. Swan at that place where they met with an enthusiastic reception from the loyal citizens.

Evacuation of Great Bethel by the Rebels—Death of Major Winthrop.

Fortress Monroe, June 12, (via Baltimore, June 13.) Further accounts of the Great Bethel affair say that on the disappearance of the Federal troops, the whole force of the enemy, fearing an attack under better auspices, left their entrenchments and hastily withdrew toward Yorktown, carrying away their artillery, and burning the adjacent buildings.

The Captain of the Zouaves, with their Assistant Surgeon, to-day have gone to Great Bethel with a flag of truce, and bearing a letter from Gen. Butler respecting the burial of the dead. They have not yet returned. Maj. Winthrop fell, mortally wounded, in the arms of a Vermont volunteer.

He was Aid and acting Secretary to Gen. Butler, and author of the brilliant Seventh Regiment article, in the June Atlantic Monthly. Brigadier General Pierce has not yet given an official account of the unfortunate affair.

The weather is intensely hot. Western Virginia Affairs—Prof. Lowe Ordered to Fortress Monroe. WASHINGTON, June 11.

Six more Ohio regiments have been ordered into Western Virginia, from Camp Dennison, near Cincinnati. They will immediately proceed to clear the Kanawha river of secessionists.

Six regiments of Union volunteers will be immediately organized in Western Virginia, armed and equipped by the Federal government. Prof. Lowe was to-day ordered to proceed immediately with his balloon to Fortress Monroe.

Maryland Election. BALTIMORE, June 14. Canfield, Union, is elected in the First District. It is believed that Davis is the only one defeated, and he by Mr. May, who claims to be an uncompromising enemy of secession. Thomas's majority in Washington county is four thousand.
