which rendered it quite cool.
The river continues to fall. The bars in
this vicinity are beginning to show them-
selves in spots almost all over the river,
disfiguring the appearance of our harbor very
much. Latest accounts from above report
the river receding very rapidly. On Satur-
day 33 inches were reported at Pittsburg,
at Parkersburg 31, and at Wheeling 37 inches.
At Cincinnati, yesterday, the river was sta-
tionary, with about 3 feet in the channel,
while at Louisville it was slowly reced-
ing, with 3 feet 3 inches in the canal.
There were about three feet of water on
Portland bar and the river was falling at
the rate of seven inches in 24 hours.—
The shoals between that point and this are
very treacherous, the channel being crooked
and hard to find. Hence to Cairo there are
from five to seven feet on the rising slowly.
The Mississippi is reported as worst
since about eighteen feet depth from Cairo
up to St. Louis. The lower Mississippi is
represented to be in fine boating stage,
with about fifteen feet water from Cairo to
its mouth.

RIVER ITEMS.
The weather, Sunday, was very hot
in the forenoon, but in the afternoon we
had a very heavy rain, after which it was
much cooler. Yesterday it was uncomfort-
ably warm in the earlier part of the day,
but there was a breeze earlier which pre-
vented the air from seeming close. About four
o'clock in the evening, however, it clouded
up, and we had another thunder shower,
which appeared to leave the air more cool
and the boat more oppressive than before.
But after midnight a high wind sprung up,
which rendered it quite cool.
The river continues to fall. The bars in
this vicinity are beginning to show them-
selves in spots almost all over the river,
disfiguring the appearance of our harbor very
much. Latest accounts from above report
the river receding very rapidly. On Satur-
day 33 inches were reported at Pittsburg,
at Parkersburg 31, and at Wheeling 37 inches.
At Cincinnati, yesterday, the river was sta-
tionary, with about 3 feet in the channel,
while at Louisville it was slowly reced-
ing, with 3 feet 3 inches in the canal.
There were about three feet of water on
Portland bar and the river was falling at
the rate of seven inches in 24 hours.—
The shoals between that point and this are
very treacherous, the channel being crooked
and hard to find. Hence to Cairo there are
from five to seven feet on the rising slowly.
The Mississippi is reported as worst
since about eighteen feet depth from Cairo
up to St. Louis. The lower Mississippi is
represented to be in fine boating stage,
with about fifteen feet water from Cairo to
its mouth.
