Meager Returns Show a Slight Gain for Harrison Over the Vote of 1884.

CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—From returns received at the City Hall up to 8:30 o'clock it is estimated that Cleveland's plurality in this city will be from 5,000 to 6,000, and that Palmer (Dem.), for Governor, will have a plurality of from 7,000 to 8,000.

Very few returns have been received from the counties of Illinois. The polls outside of Cook county are held open until near 7 p. m., and in many places the vote will not be reported before morning.
