MILFORD, Mass., Aug. 5.—The Rev. Adam Ballou, pastor emeritus of the Hopewell Universalist Church, died to-day, aged eighty-seven.

Adam Ballou was a lineal descendant of Marchal Guinebad Ballou, one of William the Conqueror's generals, who died in 1091.

The family settled in Rhode Island in 1616. The deceased was born in Cumberland, R. I., entered the Baptist ministry in 1822, and became a Universalist in 1823, officiating over Boston, New York, Medford, Milford, Bellingham, Mendon, and Hopewell churches. In 1848 he, with others, founded the Hopewell community, which was designed to live according to the literal interpretation of the teachings of Christ. He was a leading anti-slavery worker.
