Interesting History of the Discovery of the Well and the Excitement Caused by the Wonderful Cures Effected by its Waters.

During the past three years a large number of towns in Indiana have bored for natural gas and found none, and among these was Montezuma, a place in Parke county, this State, on the L. D. & W. railroad, sixty-five miles from Indianapolis.

A CHEMICAL ANALYSIS OF THE WATER. Prof. W. A. Noyes, Ph. D., professor of chemistry in the Rose Polytechnic Institute, at Terre Haute, has made an analysis of the water and gives the following as the mineral constituents in a United States gallon:




