PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 5.—The members of the West Greenland expedition that traveled with Lieutenant Peary a part of the way into the frozen north, who have returned to this city, say that unless rescued by a relief expedition Lieutenant Peary and his entire party will never be heard of again.

They were eight in the company that landed at Baltimore yesterday from the steamer Nyra Scotica from St. Johns, N. B.

They were sent by the Academy of Natural Science to investigate the geology, botany and biology of western Greenland.

Dr. Robert S. Peary, one of the party, says: "Our expedition was entirely distinct from Lieutenant Peary's. He went intending to pass to the northeast point north yet reached by man. We went merely to study the west coast of Greenland."

They were exceedingly successful, but every member of our party, I believe, considers the situation of Peary and the seven companions he now has as most perilous.

He is about six hundred miles north of Upernivik, the Danish town, which trading vessels reach about once a year.

His idea when we left him was to push several hundred miles northward toward the pole and to get back to Upernivik by way of next.

"In the place north of Upernivik stretches Melville bay, which has always baffled navigators. We, in our little barkentine, the Kite, were for three weeks packed in the ice of the bay, and had given up all hope of getting out."
