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PRINCE BISMARCK SPEAKS

The Ex-Chancellor Makes a Strong States' Rights Address to His Friends.

SPEECH BY BISMARCK.

The Prince Delivers What He Calls a Jeremiad—Bureaucracy Denounced. BERLIN, July 9.—About four hundred ex-courtsmen from the principality of Lippe-Detmold visited Prince Bismarck in Friedrichshagen today.

There are seventeen federal states having only a single vote each in the Federal Council. It is divided into three categories—the small states with a vote each, Prussia with twenty-five votes and the middle states with twenty-four votes.
