**STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.**

Its Work Finished—"Julius Caesar" the Basis of the Literary Examinations.

The State Board of Education finished its work yesterday afternoon and adjourned. Three lists of questions for primary or county license examinations and three for State and professional examinations were prepared. The former examinations will be held on the last Saturdays of March, April and May, and the latter on the last Saturdays of February, March and April.

The board, commissioned high schools at Decatur, Lanes, Lagrange, North Manchester, Peru and Lagro. High schools at Orleans and Brookville were commissioned conditionally on their complying with the State Board's requirements in the way of apparatus, etc. Heretofore all commissioned high schools have required two years of Latin. The board yesterday decided that after July, 1895, such schools shall require three years of Latin study.

What will be of especial interest to teachers is the fact that at yesterday's session the State Board selected as the basis of literary work for the county examinations beginning with May, Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar." These examinations continue six months. The selection of "Julius Caesar" as a basis is regarded with much favor by those directly connected with these examinations, who look upon it as a most excellent choice.

The State board meets again Thursday, May 17.

**MRS. WALSH'S FINE.**

It Was Fixed at One Cent, and She Promptly Liquidated.

Squire Martin's court, of Haughville, was crowded yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the time set for the trial of Mrs. Walsh, who was arrested the day before for allowing her cows to wander from her premises and converting the streets into public pastures. She was not defiant or abusive to the officers when arrested, but took the case in its most serious sense. The jury, composed of citizens, was at a loss to know what punishment would be just, and returned a verdict of guilty, but with the return a light fine of one cent. The judge imposed a heavy fine, so he rendered himself safe on that point by fixing her one cent, and without assessing any costs. Mrs. Walsh promptly produced a one cent piece from her purse and asked for the change, which was given by the squire.

**BROAD RIPLE RAILROAD.**

Petition for a Vote on Subsidy Argued Before the Commissioners.

The Broad Ripple railroad petition was again before the County Commissioners yesterday. Leon O. Bailey, attorney for the petitioners, wanted the commissioners to order an election immediately and argued that they had no alternative but to do so. He said all the statute required had been complied with. The commissioners wanted to know what manner of road it was to be, whether it was to be a street railroad, and they doubted their authority to order the election for a street-railroad, and the attorney said their petition did not state and there was nothing to show that it was to be a street railroad. They were obligating themselves to build stations every half-mile and carry freight as well as passengers. Ex-Judge Irvin appeared for the reconstitutors and nothing was done by the commissioners.

**MORE WATER MAINS**

The Full Quota for the Year Is Ordered by the Board of Works.

**Sergeant Lowe Receives a Reprimand—New Standard of Height and Age for Police and Firemen.**

It was decided yesterday by the Board of Works to order the laying of the entire quantity of water pipes that can be ordered by the city during any one year. This will be done so as to give the water company ample opportunity to prepare for the spring work and also to give the company an opportunity to help, in a measure, the unemployed. Within the next few days the board will take up all petitions that are on file for water mains. Attention will first be given to the needs of the outlying districts that are now practically without fire protection. Some of the mains will be of larger size than others, and the board concluded that it would be best to give the company sufficient notice.

The first route for the mains to be laid during 1894, under the orders of the board, is to run along East Washington street from State to Rural, north on Rural to Michigan, and from thence to Florida street. There is also a large demand for water south of Washington street in the neighborhood of the Deaf and Dumb Asylum. Councilman Murphy, of the First ward, has a petition on file for water mains to get water up in his ward. The residents north of Fall creek, between Meridian and Mississippi streets have for one year or so been sending delegations to the board, begging for fire protection. There was a large crowd yesterday at the board, which is in the city limits, because the fire department could not get water. Water mains are to be laid on either street, from Michigan to Ohio. The amount of pipe the city can order the company to lay in one year is 20,000 feet.

**SERGEANT LOWE'S CASE.**

Reprimanded for Discussing Dr. Pettijohn's Character Too Freely.

The trial of Sergeant John Lowe on the charges preferred against him by Dr. Otto Pettijohn drew a large crowd to the rooms of the Board of Safety last night. After hearing a number of witnesses the board reprimanded the officer for discussing the doctor's character so freely, but found that the evidence did not clearly prove that Sergeant Lowe used the language last Sunday morning with which he was charged by Dr. Pettijohn. Patrick Maley, the flagman at the corner of Washington and Missouri streets, told of Lowe's remarks to him on the night of the trial. Dr. Pettijohn's name had come up, arose out of the discussion over the primaries held in the fifty-fifth precinct the night before. Both had heard Lowe speak of Pettijohn in a derogatory way. He had used a mild oath. Nearly all the members of the police and fire boards testified to the sergeant's efficiency as a police officer. Several of the character witnesses said they had never known him profane on a number of occasions. When the sergeant was put on the stand, Dr. Pettijohn cross-examined him and the board's bitterness was shown. The two have not spoken for three years. Jacob Miller testified that he had seen Lowe on the night of the trial just after the recent election. Mr. Newt Harding appeared for Sergeant Lowe.

**HEIGHT AND AGE STANDARD.**

Board of Safety Changes Regulation of Police and Firemen.

After hearing the charges against Sergeant Lowe, last night, the Board of Safety decided to amend the fire force regulations so that hereafter all members of the force must not be less than five feet eight inches in height and between the ages of twenty-four and forty. Policemen must come within the same limit of age. The board, however, will make exceptions to this rule, in cases where a man is peculiarly fitted for his duties and has rendered efficient services in the department where he serves.

It was decided to ask the city attorney to have appraisers appointed by the Circuit Court in order to sell condemned horses and material from the fire department. Edward Rowland, the driver of chemical No. 1, offered his resignation to the board. It was accepted. The board is going to business. Richard Brown, having passed a satisfactory examination, was appointed to a position in the fire department. M. A. Millwright, merchant policeman, who has been watching the market house, was dropped from the pay roll. The regular police force will look out for duty.

Complaint was made that since the quarantining of fremont went into force the firemen have been sending to the Board of Safety office orders for their salary. The board announced that it would not issue such orders.

Markmaster Koehne wanted the board to make some provision for the firemen on the spaces formerly occupied by the hay-market. He said the city would gain \$200,000 in rent by making the improvement. He also had a plan for building a city hall on the site, similar to that given several weeks ago in the Journal. His communication was referred to the Board of Works, with a request that the board either purchase the ground now occupied by the hay-market on West Maryland street or make arrangements for another suitable site. L. S. Ayres, who rents to the city a stable the ground next to the stationhouse, wanted the board to pay the sprinkling apparatus for the property. His communication was referred to the Board of Safety and was referred to the Board of Works.

The board looked over a number of plans for a new patrol wagon submitted by Superintendent Powell.

**WHAT THE BOARD WANTS.**

The Public Works Department Submits Its Annual Report.

The annual report of the Board of Works, which is to be given shortly to the Mayor, will call attention to the unsatisfactory system of street sweeping and sprinkling and the manner of making assessments. The board thinks the charter should be amended in some manner to make the assessments and the system more satisfactory. The garbage contract is also commented upon. The board does not believe it is successful as it is rendered at present. The board wants the overhead wires in the city districts put under ground. In statistics furnished it is shown that the system of cleaning the streets by hand is much more expensive than cleaning them by machines, although the machine method is not by far so satisfactory. The new board has let contracts for nearly four miles of sewers, aggregating a cost of more than \$111,000.

**ON FRIDAY IT EXPIRES.**

The Old Street-Car Charter Ends Its Existence To-Morrow.

On Friday the old charter of the Citizens' Street-railroad Company expires, so it was claimed by the city attorney under the old administration, and on this date the Mayor's cabinet will hold a meeting. The date falls on to-morrow. The Mayor has not been instructed to prepare papers for the expiration of the charter. The matter will be brought up at the meeting of the city council, so as to determine the city's rights at an early date.

**To Have South Meridian.**

The Board of Works yesterday ordered the city engineer to prepare papers for the improvement of South Meridian street from Washington to the Union tracks. The material was not named, as that will be determined upon the settlement of the property owners. The board is not averse to laying granite blocks on the street. As there is not one resident property owner on the street, the thoroughfare being built up with business blocks, the board will not be hampered with remonstrances. It is the intention of the board to have the work begun in the spring.

**LABOR LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.**

Lively Discussion of Politics and Street-Railroad Matters.

At the regular meeting of the legislative council, Sunday, politics had full sway, and the members showed a disposition to take a stand on political questions. It was the opinion of most of the delegates that more would be accomplished at the next session of the Legislature than formerly, as it was evident that a spirit of independence was being generated in the working classes. The biennial session of the State council will convene the first Monday in March, and from present indications, the meetings will be largely attended. At this session the council will take up a declaration of principles and endeavor to have the old parties endorse, falling in which, other means of securing the ends desired may be adopted.

Superintendent McLean and the street car company came in for a full share of the "roasting" that seemed in order, and the action of the brotherhood in surrendering the street cars to the wire-cords committee was appointed to draft resolutions defining the attitude of the council in regard to the company.

**STONE MASONS FINISH**

Convention Has Been the Most Successful the Union Has Held.

Treasury in Good Condition—Notes of a Defaulting Ex-Treasurer—Old Officers Re-Elected.

The stone-masons' international convention adjourned at 5 o'clock last evening after a busy and important session of eight days. Much of the business transacted by the body was of little interest to the public, but of great importance to the order. Yesterday the committee reports were read, and the utmost harmony prevailed, and the delegates unite in the assertion that the convention just closed has been an exceedingly agreeable and pleasant one. After settling all outstanding indebtedness the convention adjourns with a surplus of \$2,600 in the treasury. Settlements were made with a number of subordinate unions which had overpaid their assessments during the strike at Liverpool, O., a year ago. The amounts paid back to the subordinate lodges will be of great assistance in the maintenance of unemployed and needy members.

Three years ago the treasurer of the International Union embezzled \$700, and a short time afterward he was killed in an accident at Baltimore, Md. Before his death there was an effort made to compromise the matter and the union accepted three notes for \$300 each. The notes were not paid, and at this session of the union the matter of their collection was discussed. The members think it highly probable that they will ever realize anything from the paper. Before adjournment the board of directors adopted a resolution thanking the Journal and Labor Signal for efforts in securing accurate reports of the convention.

**GIVEN LEAVE OF ABSENCE.**

Lottie Bruce, Consort of a Notorious Burglar, Sent Out of Town.

Lottie Bruce visited friends in this city. The announcement was made through the medium of the police instead of the society reporter. She is known in nearly every large city in the country as the "burglar queen," and her appearance in a city is almost invariably a forerunner of burglaries and foot-paddling. She was arrested by detectives Kinney and Richards upon the charge of being a prostitute in the Police Court yesterday morning. She was then very anxious to leave the city, and Superintendent Powell said the police department would not accept of her unless she would leave the city from her feet. She asked that the time be extended till 6 o'clock, and she was granted. She was released from her feet. She was watched to see that she left the city. She was arrested in the city on the charge of burglary and safebreaking, and was sentenced to twelve years in the Prison South from Terre Haute, for "doing time" in the southern penitentiary.
