Last of the Long Correspondence Over the Hawaiian Affair.

President Dole's Reply to Minister Willis's Explanation of the Corwin and Other Incidents.

WASHINGTON, March 19.—President Cleveland transmitted to Congress to-day the final correspondence arising out of the request made by President Dole, of the Hawaiian provisional government, upon Minister Willis for information as to whether or not the United States government would use force to effect the Queen's restoration.

In a letter to President Dole, under date of Feb. 14, Minister Willis informed Mr. Dole that on the 20th ult. he was notified by his government that the Hawaiian question had been submitted to Congress and that his special instructions had been fully complied with.
