TWELVE MEN MISSING.

Supposed to Have Perished in the Glucose Works Fire at Buffalo.

BUFFALO, N. Y., April 3.—The full extent of the loss of life by the burning of the American glucose works is still uncertain. About eighty men were working in the building when the fire broke out, but how many escaped and who among them perished cannot yet be determined.

To avoid death in the burning building, leaped from the scaffolding or crevices under falling walls; others to-day were only to be imbedded in mud. Two men who jumped from the burning building into the canal were but slightly hurt. Inquiries have been made by relatives for the following twelve workmen, who are missing and supposed to have been burned or crushed to death: John Blume, John Casper, Michael Gintig, John Huber, George Jephia, Tony Hoffman, Joseph H. The loss, although overestimated in the early reports, is still larger than this city has experienced in any other fire. It is now estimated that the loss to the glucose works proper will not exceed \$600,000; fully covered by insurance.

Emperor Wilhelm at Vienna.

VIENNA, April 13.—Emperor William arrived here to-day on his way to the Southern railroad station by Emperor Francis Joseph. He was met by the heads of the local authorities and by the German ambassador and the Austrian minister. The Emperor was profusely decorated for the occasion and was surrounded by the troops, who kept back the crowds of people who wished to greet the German Emperor. Emperor William was most enthusiastically cheered by the popular and received highly pleased at the reception accorded him. DIED AT EIGHTY-NINE

David Dudley Field Falls a Victim to Quick Pneumonia. Returned to New York Wednesday from a Trip Abroad—His Life Work as a Foremost Jurist.

NEW YORK, April 13.—David Dudley Field died to-day at No. 22 Gramercy Park. Mr. Field arrived from Italy only last Wednesday on the steamer Columbia. He had gone abroad to take Christmas dinner with his only child, Lady Musgrave, and to attend the twenty-first birthday celebration of his eldest son, Dudley Field Musgrave. His daughter is the widow of Sir Anthony Musgrave, who was Governor of Queensland, Australia, when he died. She is living at East Grinstead, Sussex county, about twenty miles from London.

After visiting his daughter Mr. Field traveled about on the continent and took the steamer from Genoa for home. He has been at his home, No. 22 Gramercy Park, since his return, and was thought to be in good health for a man of his age—eighty-nine years. When Mr. Field landed from the steamer Wednesday a terrible blizzard was in full blast. He remained on the deck fully an hour to claim his baggage, and was then driven to the residence of his daughter-in-law in Gramercy square.

For the remainder of the day he was bright, cheerful and entertaining. At 3 o'clock Thursday morning the household was aroused to learn that Mr. Field was suffering from a severe congestive chill. The physician who was called detected the presence of pneumonia, but no great anxiety was felt by the family until 3 o'clock this morning. The end came to the distinguished jurist as he slept. Mr. Field had expected to spend his summer among the Berkshires, his winter at East Grinstead. He was engaged in writing his autobiography. Only last Wednesday he remarked: "I am writing my autobiography, and I am glad to say that I am not yet at the end of my journey. David Dudley Field furnished one of the most remarkable examples of the prosecution of the vigor of body and mind beyond what is looked upon as usually the limit of activity.
