

COLOMBIA APPEASED

ITS MINISTER MAY NOW COME DOWN FROM HIS "HIGH HORSE."

The Little Republic Pleas Because the Retaliatory Proclamation Has Been Annulled—European Crops.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—A sharp diplomatic disagreement between the United States of Colombia and the United States of America has just been brought to a close. The difference grew out of and has existed ever since President Harrison, in March, 1892, issued a retaliatory proclamation against Colombia, under the provisions of the McKinley act, because of the latter's refusal to negotiate a reciprocity treaty with the United States, as had been done by other Central and South American countries.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—Assistant Secretary Reynolds, of the Interior Department, has decided that Section 4718 of the Revised Statutes, relative to the payment of accrued pensions to applicants for pensions under the act of July 27, 1852, granting pensions to the survivors of certain Indian wars, is unconstitutional.
