

SILVER IS PROMINENT

ADVANCE SCORED ON THIS SIDE TO 65.75 FOR BULLION.

Stock Exchange Markets Irregular and Volume of Business Smaller

Local Markets Firm.

At New York yesterday's money on call was prime at 2 1/2 per cent; last loan, 2; close, 2.

Prime mercantile paper, 4 1/2 per cent. Sterling exchange was strong, with a slight advance in bankers' bills at 4 1/2 per cent.

Total sales of stock were 134,700 shares, including: American Tobacco, 6,000; Atholton, 5,000; Burlington, 12,000; Chicago Gas, 2,500; Distilling, 2,400; Louisville & Nashville, 4,000; Missouri Pacific, 4,000; Reading, 4,200; Rock Island, 4,000; St. Paul, 10,000; Silver certificates, 150,000; Tennessee Coal and Iron, 5,000; United States Leather, 5,000; United States Lumber, 4,000; Washburn preferred, 4,000.

The volume of stock speculation yesterday fell short of Thursday's tally by about 4,000 shares. Pool manipulation and the operations of the room traders accounted for the greater part of the dealings.

The irregularity of the market during the last week or two was again evident. The industrial shares, however, are a little better. The general market was influenced by foreign selling of the international railroad.

There were no transactions in government bonds, although several amounts changed hands over the counter. The speculation in State bonds was entirely dormant.
